

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

This is with regard to the request of Mr. Mario B. Narita, President, MBN Trading Corporation, for issuance of approval/endorsement by the Sanggunian as requirement for his application of a Mineral Processing Permit (MPP) before the Mines and Geosciences Bureau 10 (MGB 10).

That the said application involves high potential for significant negative environmental impact, and therefore subject to the issuance of Social Acceptability Certificate by this office. Pursuant to DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2002 – 200, "Issuance of Social Acceptability Endorsements by LGUs on programs and projects requiring Environmental Clearance Certificates", and City Ordinance No. 8641 – 2003, respectively. The latter imposes a fee for the issuance of Social Acceptability Certificate, through the CLENRO, for projects covered by the Environmental Impact System (EIS).

Francis D./Jocelyn M. Del Rosario (Plaintiff) versus Leoven Pagalan, Gretchen Lagrada, Bebe Bagsinao, Marcelino Roa, Meriam Galdiano, Encar Galon and Fernando Cabigquez, et. Al. (Defendants)". The PDC was conducted upon request by Sheriff Benjamin T. Dingal III pursuant to DILG Memorandum Circular 2014-82, dated, July 17, 2014, providing for the "GUIDELINES ON REQUESTING FOR POLICE ASSISTANCE IN DEMOLITION OR EVICTION ACTIVITIES UNDER THE URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING ACT OF 1992."

Per report issued by the Local Government Unit of Cagayan de Oro City, two (2) of the Five (5) affected families initially qualified for relocation & resettlement under R.A. 7279, otherwise known as the Urban Development and Housing Act of 1992. At present, the LGU of Cagayan de Oro City does not have relocation or financial assistance available for these qualified affected families. They were only advised to submit their application to avail of the LGU's "future" relocation program/projects. In the absence of the relocation/resettlement or financial assistance, the implementation of the writ of demolition and eviction can be a case of non-compliance of Section 28 of R.A 7279 on just and humane demolition and eviction.

As to the other Three (3) families, the City Housing and Urban Development Department, through their Application and Profiling Section, has submitted a Household Listing indicating that they are not qualified beneficiaries for resettlement/ relocation or financial assistance as provided under RA 7279.

LGU committed to provide transportation assistance and distribution of relief goods on the day of the implementation of the demolition and eviction through the City Mayor's and City Social Welfare and Development Office.







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1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Pueblo de Oro Development Corporation proposed Masterson Mile North mixed-used projects, composed of a high-rise residential/commercial condominium located in Carmen, Cagayan de Oro City.

The consultant is to study the surrounding intersections and significant thoroughfares within the vicinity. The traffic survey conducted started with the traffic count in the major thoroughfares in the area. The count was during the morning and afternoon peak hour traffic. Data gathered from the survey was used for traffic analysis.

The study was able to identify the prevailing traffic situation. Upon careful analysis, the project identifies potential impact. However, mitigating measures can minimize any potential impact on future traffic.

2.0 OBJECTIVE

The following are the objectives of the study/analysis:

- Traffic count data analyze the current traffic scenario on the nearby road.
- · Current traffic count determined.
- Project the estimated traffic that the project will generate.
- Trip Generation
 - The trip generation rates adopted in the study are the established ITE Generation rates. It is based on the type of development and the area of the project. The commercial and residential areas considered are the size of the facility, as this will be the basis of the number of generated trips.
 - o Assess the impact of the generated traffic of the project.
 - Forecast data based on trip generation, current traffic count, and volume capacity analysis.
 - o Forecast the future traffic based on the future proposals for the area.

3.0 METHODOLOGY

- Traffic count conducted is to get the volume of vehicles passing along the proposed project's areas.
- The tabulated data collected from the Traffic Count is to get the total vehicle passing along these areas. Based on the data collected, the level of service will be determined, which will be the basis of the analysis of this traffic impact study.
- The Level of Service (LOS) established in the Highway Capacity Manual is the adopted reference to determine the area's situation. The street studied is identified as urban streets in terms of functionality.

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• The roads are described as having high-density traffic with two or more lanes. There are significant parking and Traffic signals within a kilometer stretch.

3.1 Level of Service

Table 1. Level of Service (LOS)

Level of Service	Description
A	Describes primarily free—flow operations at average travel speeds, usually about 90 percent of the free-flow rate for the given street class. Vehicles are entirely unchecked in their ability to maneuver within the traffic stream. Control delay at the signalized Intersection is minimal.

Each traffic volume corresponds to the number of vehicles per hour. For Levels A and B, categories applicable on the level count below C. An ideal traffic situation should be below C. While LOS C is still manageable, levels higher than C are critical. Based on these classifications, this traffic impact study will evaluate the prevailing traffic situation. After that, projections are based on the ITE Generation Rates. (See separate section for traffic generation)

The table above shows the vehicle growth rate based on the study conducted by the Land Transportation Office. This table shows how a particular type of vehicle has increased annually.

Passenger car space is equivalent to the tabulated raw data converted from the existing traffic count. The volume of a specific lane will be determined from the converted data. It is necessary to adopt the equivalent rather than the raw count data on volume as each vehicle determines the space and the passenger capacity. Hence, it will have a better comparison of traffic volume.


Total peak hours volume is determined by adding the average volume for the peak hour period. Determining the highest volume multiplied by 4. According to the Highway Capacity Manual, PHFs in urban areas range between 0.80 and 0.98. Lower values signify more significant flow variability within the observed hour, and higher values indicate minor flow variation. PHFs over 0.95 often show high traffic volumes, sometimes with capacity constraints on flow during the peak hour.

4.1 Location



Based on the map from the project proponent, the proposed residential project is situated within Barangay Carmen, Cagayan de Oro City, which can be accessed through Masterson Ave and passes through the city's uptown area.

The area surveyed shows that the same developer Pueblo De Oro is the developer of the project within the vicinity of the developed area. The project is one of the phases for the entire master plan known as the Pueblo de Oro Township, a combination of high-density and medium-density residential/commercial units.













- On the other hand, Masterson Ave (Uptown Bound) got its share of traffic, mostly from downtown vehicles. It only has 8% of the vehicles coming from Macapagal Ave.
- Vehicles from Macapagal road are moving towards the downtown area, with 82% of the total traffic pointing towards the said direction. Only 18% of the traffic is moving towards the uptown area.
- Vehicles towards Macapagal Road mostly come from the Downtown area with an estimated 80% and only 20% from the Uptown area.
- The above road tracing diagram shows that Masterson Ave (SM Uptown Bound) has most of its traffic from the Xavier Estate counterpart. Only 4% of the traffic is coming from El Camino Real.
- On the other hand, Masterson Ave (Xavier Estate Bound) got its share of traffic, mainly from SM Uptown vehicles. There is also a significant contribution from El Camino with 36%.

For the Afternoon peak hour, here are the analysis

- Level of Service E identified on the following lanes:
 - o Masterson Ave. (From Downtown)
 - o Masterson Ave. (Uptown Bound)
 - o Masterson Ave. (From Xavier Estate)
 - o Masterson Ave. (From Sm Uptown)
 - o Masterson Ave. (Xavier Estate Bound)

These areas are experiencing heavy traffic flow. They are characterized by significant delays and average travel speeds of 33 percent or less of the free-flow rate. Such operations are caused by negative progression, high signal density, high volumes, extensive delays at critical intersections, and inappropriate signal timing.

- The following are at Level of Service D
 - o Masterson Ave. (From Downtown)
 - o Masterson Ave. (Uptown Bound)
 - o Masterson Ave. (Sm Uptown Bound)

Level D is described as borders on a range in which small increases in flow may cause substantial increases in delay and decreased travel speed. LOS D may be due to adverse signal progression, inappropriate signal timing, high volumes, or a combination of these factors. Average travel speeds are about 40 percent of free-flow speed.

- The project may have impacted the following road lanes with a projected volume increase of 10%.
 - o Masterson Ave. (Uptown Bound)

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- o El Camino Real (From Pueblo)
- o El Camino Real (Pueblo Bound)
- Masterson Ave. (From Xavier Estate)
- Based on the 10-year projection, most road lanes are in LOS E for the afternoon peak hour.

8.3 Proposed 6 Lanes Road Network

The Department of Public Works and Highways planned to widen the road network along the Masterson Avenue to lessen the congestion during the morning and afternoon peak hours along the intersections. The 6 lanes as proposed would accommodate an additional load of service in the future. The figure below shows the projected situation of LOS with the proposed 6 lanes road network and the impact of the proposed project trip generation and attraction.



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9.0 FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS, AND RECOMMENDATIONS

9.1 Findings

After the thorough data presentation and analysis, the following are the findings of this traffic impact study:

- Based on the project details, the the project could meet the minimum 1:6 ratio requirements for parking.
- The morning peak hour rate indicates that the generation estimated at 305 vehicle trips for the entire project for the morning peak hour period is given at 100% completion. While the afternoon peak hour period for both incoming and outgoing is at 354 vehicles.
- The morning peak period is the same for Intersections 1 and 2 from 7:30 am to 8:00 am. At the same time, it is 5:00 pm to 5:30 pm for Intersection 1 and 5:30 pm to 6:00 pm for Intersection 2 for the afternoon peak hour period.
- The following roads will have a minimal projected impact:
 - o Masterson Ave. (Uptown Bound)
 - o El Camino Real (From Pueblo)
 - o El Camino Real (Pueblo Bound)
 - o Masterson Ave. (From Xavier Estate)
- Projected 10-year traffic shows at critical level LOS E for the impacted intersections if no widening project along with this road networks. This increase is brought about by the development of establishments within the area.
- The Department of Public Works and Highways had a plan of widening the Masterson Miles Avenue from four (4) lanes into six (6) lanes that may mitigate the future LOS E.
- The project site had several access routes that can be utilized to avoid peak hour traffic along the existing route in traveling towards the Cagayan de Oro business district.
 - Red color route line is the SM By-pass Road connecting the Macapagal Highway
 - Blue color route is the existing route that experienced peak hour congestion with LOS E.
 - Yellow color is the longest access route to/from the project site the Diversion route

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9.2 Conclusion

- Although foreseen that the proposed project may have a minimal potential impact, there are also mitigating measures to be able to minimize any potential flow problem:
 - Alternative routes are available for incoming and outgoing traffic. Hence, any potential intersection point, especially those considered critical levels during the morning peak hour period can be avoided.
 - o Additional flow is mitigated through traffic pattern awareness that may change the behavior and daily routines of the future residents of the project.
 - o The City Government and Barangay may promote carpooling which would also impact and help in minimizing traffic generation. At the same time, providing mass transport access can also reduce potential vehicle buyers.
- Though the project foresees creating a minimal traffic impact along the two
 intersections studied, the economic value of the proposed project outweighs the
 projected traffic impact. However, it is also imperative to consider the
 recommendations in helping minimize or lessen traffic impact.
- The presence of the by-pass and diversion road networks lessen the impact of the project's trip generated and attracted traffic during the peak hour period.

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 Encourage the local government unit of Cagayan de Oro City and the Department of Public Works and Highways to prioritize the implementation of the road widening along the Masterson Avenue.

9.3 Recommendation

The study recommended the following to minimize any further traffic generation:

- The City Government through the Roads and Traffic Administration and in coordination with public transportation groups would facilitate terminals or stopping points for jeepneys and other public utilities within walking distance from the project vicinity. This will ease commuters and discourage future residents from purchasing vehicles due to a cheaper alternative.
- Ensure retail businesses and services include that considered a necessity to minimize any additional vehicle trips the following:
 - Retail groceries
 - Pharmacies
 - Laundry shop
 - Convenience store
 - Barbershop/beauty salon
 - Bakeshop
 - Childcare / daycare center
- The proposed projects should be able to accommodate a work-from-home setup. This
 would require a strong internet connection, reliable lines of communication or signal,
 and an uninterrupted power supply. The presence of infrastructure to cater to work
 from the home setup is imperative for the post-COVID pandemic. More people may
 be on this setup than the traditional office setup.

10.0 TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT AND POLICIES

10.1 Rationale

Creating a harmonious traffic flow of vehicles moving to and from the proposed project site is the primary goal of this proposed traffic management policies and procedures. This document will guide the project proponents in implementing a systematic approach to traffic management through the different phases, the construction phase, the post-construction phase, the transitional or moving in phase, and the daily operational phase. This set of guidelines contributes to the safety and well-being of everyone within its vicinity.

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10.2 Traffic Phases and Guidelines during Different Phases

102.1 CONSTRUCTION PHASE

- 1. Vehicles used for mobilization must be delivered and designated in strategic areas wherein it is easy to move and maneuver.
- 2. Delivery zones must be established and should be within the vicinity of the construction site in order not to impede the general traffic.
- 3. Scheduling of deliverables implemented such that heavy equipment and delivery trucks should be scheduled beyond the morning and afternoon peak hour period to avoid any potential delays.
- 4. Avoid peak hour periods designated for deliveries except for light delivery vehicles that may not pose any potential traffic impediments.
- Designate temporary parking areas for contractors, laborers, engineers, and other important persons involved during the pre-construction phase. Parking should be regulated to avoid any potential collision or damage to properties.
- 6. At all times, traffic safety must be implemented.
- 7. Designated roadways must be free from any obstructions in an emergency.
- 8. Only heavy equipment must be deployed when needed and parked at its designated location to avoid potential obstruction.
- 9. Designate a walking path for pedestrians to ensure safety and avoid potential accidents with vehicles and heavy equipment. Establish visible barriers.

10.2.2 CLEARING AND POST-CONSTRUCTION PHASE

- 1. Maintain and designate areas for hauling trucks and heavy equipment.
- 2. Utilize the parking area for general parking
- 3. Eliminate any potential obstruction along the roadways
- 4. Maintain and establish a pedestrian walk path
- 5. Observe hauling schedules beyond the morning and afternoon peak hour period. Minimize hauling operations during peak hours and utilize a light hauling truck.
- 6. Designate traffic marshals at the egress points

10.2.2 OPERATIONAL PHASE

10.2.2.1 Identified Problems and Mitigating Measures

a.) Lack of traffic discipline among motorists and drivers

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One of the areas of great concern is the lack of discipline among drivers and motorists. These include stopping in areas that may potentially block the general traffic flow, parking anywhere, a sudden shift of lanes without proper maneuvering, and overspeeding.

b.) Undesignated pedestrian lanes or walking path

Traffic management does not only concern motorized vehicles; it also acknowledges the importance of the pedestrian as one of the focal concerns of the project proponents. Unregulated pedestrian traffic may result in potential accidents by the walking traffic and obstruction of general traffic flow that may cause unnecessary delays.

c.) Unregulated and unmonitored traffic flow at the egress point

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One of the areas prone to vehicle collisions and accidents is the egress points where internal traffic flow will merge with the public. Without any measures to guide internal traffic or assist incoming vehicles, accidents and collisions may result.

d.) Longer wait time for collision intervention and accident response

The possible collisions and accidents should be avoided; it is also important to establish the systematic implementation of speedy responses to crashes and accidents. For colliding vehicles, installing CCTV cameras along the main traffic areas within the vicinity will decrease downtime as the accident may be reviewed from the captured monitors. The response to emergencies is also necessary in case of an accident.

10.2.2.2 Major Areas of Concerns and Implementing Guidelines:

a.) <u>Bottleneck Intersections</u> where delays usually occur, resulting in the platooning of vehicles.

Removing any impending obstruction along the bottlenecks will ensure a smooth traffic flow. Hence, it is imperative to designate areas for pick up and drop off and no-stopping zones. In some cases, the drop-off area may also pose a bottleneck zone. Effective management of drop-off could minimize any potential delays and time loss.

b.) <u>U-turn slots</u> are designated points wherein vehicles may turn back by merging with the opposite traffic.

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Designating U-turn slots that may have potential risk from the opposing lanes may minimize unregulated U-turns.

c.) <u>Blindspot intersections</u> areas that may not be visible from the other intersecting lanes may potentially trigger collisions and accidents.

Creating stop signs along blind spot intersections may reduce any potential collision of vehicles.

d.) Parking area designated part of the vicinity that is dedicated to parking.

The parking area must be defined and designated with consideration for persons with disabilities. Also, parking must be regulated and monitored correctly to avoid any potential property damage.

e.) <u>Internal roadways</u> are the roads within the project vicinity that will lead to general traffic.

Roadways must be free from any obstructions, including idling vehicles, unauthorized parking, and unregulated pedestrian movement. The routes must also be ready for emergency responding vehicles such as police cars, ambulances, and firetrucks.





WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the 1987 Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines mandates the protection and advancement of the right of Filipino People to a healthful and balanced ecology, provides for the promotion of social justice, guarantees the right of the people and their organization to reasonable participation at all levels of social, political and economic decision making.

WHEREAS, Republic Act (RA) No. 7160 known as the Local Government Code (Code) directed and authorized the local government to establish, maintain, preserve and conserve communal forest and watersheds.

WHEREAS, Executive Order 192 mandates the DENR as the primary government agency responsible for the conservation, management and protection, and proper use and sustainable development of the country's environmental and natural resources and the LGUs, who have likewise the responsibility for sustainable management and development of forest resources and watersheds within their territories, mutually commit themselves to pursue such objectives under a multiple and sustainable use, demand driven and participation, development approach.

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9275 known as the Philippine Clean Water Act of 2004 aims to protect the country's water bodies from pollution from land-based sources (industries and commercial establishments, agriculture and community/household activities). The law also provides for a comprehensive and integrated strategy to prevent and minimize pollution through a multi-sectoral and participatory approach involving all the stakeholders;

WHEREAS, RA 9003, otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000, provides the necessary policy framework, institutional mechanism, and mandates of the LGUs to divert at least 25% of solid waste through establishing an integrated solid waste management plan giving emphasis to reusing, recycling, and composting activities and other resource recovery approaches. There is a need to emphasize that as per RA 9003, open dump sites shall not be allowed as final disposal sites. If an open dumpsite is existing, the LGU shall be sanctioned for its non-compliance to Section 37 of RA 9003. The LGU shall be required to prepare a Safe Closure and Rehabilitation Plan based on the DENR general guidelines set under DAO 2006-09. Sanitary landfill shall be developed and operated as a final disposal site for residual waste of a municipality or city or cluster of these LGUs. Sanitary landfill shall be designed and operated in accordance with the guidelines set under Sections 40 and 41 of RA 9003.

WHEREAS, RA 8371, otherwise known as the Indigenous Peoples Rights Act of 1997, to ensure genuine exercise and/or protect the rights of ICCs/IPs to Free and Prior Informed Consent (FPIC), whenever applicable, which includes their right in the introduction and implementation of plans, programs, projects, activities and other undertakings that will affect them and their ancestral domains to ensure their economic, social and cultural well-being.

WHEREAS, the role of non-government, people's and civic organizations in local governance and administration in the area of environmental protection and management is promoted and mandated in the Local Government Code.

WHEREAS, RA No. 9996 of the Mindanao Development Authority Act of 2010, created the Mindanao Development Authority (MinDA), which is tasked to establish an effective institutional mechanism to address the need for a coordinated and integrated approach in the formulation and integration of a Mindanao-wide, inter-regional development plans, programs and projects;

WHEREAS, the management of watersheds should achieve the goals of (1) sustainable multiple use of natural resources within the watersheds in a manner that is environmentally sound, economically viable and socially acceptable; and (2) the prevention of further watershed degradation and the restoration of the productive and protective function of currently degraded watersheds.

WHEREAS, effective and purposive collaboration and coordination of development initiatives among all stakeholders in a watershed including LGUs, National Government Agencies, Non-Government Organizations, Social/People's Organizations, Religious and Security Groups, and the Business Sector, will hasten and facilitate the achievement of these goals.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, herein parties commit to bind themselves and agree as follows:

Section 1. Vision of the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds Management Council. A robust, resilient and nourishing cluster of watersheds that provides vital ecological services and amenities essential to our economy, food security and human survival.

Section 2. Roles and Functions of the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watershed Management Council – The Council, among others, shall have the following functions and responsibilities:

- Serve as the de-facto governing body with oversight responsibility body for the operation, supervision, management, protection and rehabilitation of the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds;
- 2. Serve as the coordination body for national, provincial, regional and field government offices, local government units, non-government organizations, and civil society in the harmonization of sectoral plans and other related initiatives intended for the development and sustainability of the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds;
- 3. Serve as the oversight body cum monitoring functions for various government agencies and corporations at the local level undertaking relevant river basin/watershed initiatives and projects, such as, but not limited to watershed rehabilitation, flood mitigation, environmental protection, and integrated water resources management;
- 4. Harmonize all policies and directives relative to the purpose of this agreement issued by relevant government agencies, local governments and other authorized entities for purposes of making these policies adaptable to local watershed situations;
- 5. Serve as a platform for dissemination, consultation, conflict resolution and dialogue of advocacies or plans and initiatives which concern the protection, conservation, management and development of the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds;
- 6. Provide guidance and direction to the various working groups and subsumed units under the organizational structure of the Council, an updated copy of which is herein attached in the annexes;
- 7. Take the lead in representing the collective advocacies, plans and aspirations of the members in various fora and events;

- 8. Under a collaborative arrangement of augmentation and complementation, the Council may call on any member to extend assistance for the furtherance of activities implemented by a member requesting for support;
- 9. Promote cooperation and teamwork among members especially that involves planning and policy formulation, inter-agency coordination, collaboration, convergence, and complementation and cost sharing;
- 10. Coordinate with existing management bodies (Protected Area Management Board, Water Quality Management Area Governing Board, Metro CDO Airshed Governing Board, Macajalar Bay Development Alliance, etc.) present within the cluster watershed to ensure complementation of the various programs, projects and activities;
- 11. Perform such other actions necessary in the pursuance of its functions and responsibilities appertaining to initiatives relevant to the management and conservation of the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds; and
- 12. Regular conduct of Executive Committee and Technical Working Group Meetings that will serve as a venue to discuss significant matters concerning sustainable development and target priorities of Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds.

Section 3. Composition and Commitment of the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds Management Council — the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds Management Council (ACCWMC) shall be composed of the Heads of Offices of the National Government Agencies, Local Chief Executives, Social/Peoples Organizations, etc of all members to this Agreement (see attached organizational structure).

Section 4. Commitment of the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watershed Management Council Executive Committee and Technical Working Groups

A. The Executive Committee:

The Regional Executive Director of the DENR-10 shall act as the Chairperson of the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds Management Council - Executive Committee. Its Co-chairpersons are the heads of offices of DILG-10, NEDA-10, City LGU of Cagayan de Oro, Provincial LGU of Bukidnon, and the Oro Chamber of Commerce and Industry. Together with the members (refer to the organizational structure), the Executive Committee shall perform the following functions:

- 1. Exercise over-all coordination, integration, complementation and implementation of the respective plans, programs, projects and activities being implemented in the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds and its consistency with the Watershed Management Plan;
- 2. Oversee the integration, adaptation, implementation and applicability of watershed related policies, plans, programs and activities;
- 3. Create sectoral committees to handle specific thematic developmental and management concerns relative to the review of specific policies and implementation of identified programs and projects within the watershed;
- 4. Advocate for the integrated and sustainable management, development and multi- stakeholder participation in the protection and development of natural resources within Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds;
- 5. Address operational and implementation issues and concerns among local partners and agencies affecting their specific covered areas;

- 6. Coordinate and link with other management bodies on inter watershed activities:
- 7. Formulate schemes/procedures to mobilize financial resource and logistic support including human resource to support and sustain the operations of the Council, Sector Committees and Secretariat;
- 8. Monitor, assess and oversee agreed outputs and outcomes of local partners and agencies operating within the watershed; and
- 9. Establish, collect, update and maintain a watershed database and information monitoring system and integrate/link this system to other database and information systems of other partner agencies and LGUs.

B. The Technical Working Groups (TWGs)

The Technical Working Group shall function as a community of practice, consist of experts to support capacity of member stakeholders on the reconstitution and implementation of Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds that will align to the national priorities and coherent with the DENR Administrative Order 2021-41: "Guidelines in the Creation of Watershed Management Councils".

B.1 Rehabilitation TWG

The DENR CENRO Initao shall act as the Chairperson of the Rehabilitation TWG of the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds. Together with NCIP-10 as Co-Chairperson and the members (refer to the organizational structure), the TWG shall perform the following functions:

- 1. Coordinate with the LGUs, NGAs, NGOs, Academe, Religious Groups and other stakeholders in the continuous planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of projects and other activities geared toward the sustainable development of Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds;
- 2. Facilitate in the filing of criminal charges against violators of environmental and forestry laws within the Watersheds; and
- 3. Facilitate and/or assist in the compliance of Free and Prior Informed Consent

B.2 Resource Management TWG

The USTP-Cagayan de Oro Campus shall act as Chairperson of the Resource Management TWG. Together with the Oro Chamber of Commerce and Industry as Co-Chairperson and the members (refer to the organizational structure), the TWG shall perform the following functions:

- 1. Assist and support the conduct of Research and Development (R and D) projects/activities related to watershed in coordination with the concerned agencies;
- 2. Assist in designing a resource utilization fee scheme and the implementing mechanism;
- 3. Integrate in the localization and contextualization of the curriculum implemented by schools located within and/or adjacent to the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds the principles behind the ACCWMC and the affirmative actions implemented by its members; and
- 4. Gather information and provide technical references on the existing land and water resources use in coordination with the communities (ICCs), LGUs, government agencies, academe, and other institutions particularly; Inventory/Collection of data from various universities/institutions, and Information Sharing River Basin resource management

B.3 Local Governance TWG

The **DILG-10** shall act as the **Chairperson** of the Local Governance TWG. Together with the **Municipality of Libona as Co-Chairperson** and the members (*refer to the organizational structure*), the TWG shall perform the following functions:

- 1. Spearhead the alliance building activities between the national government agencies and identified LGUs in order to enhance the capacity towards delivery of services for the sustainable management resources within watershed;
- 2. Review laws, policies and ordinances; identify gaps and conflicting provisions; and propose policy recommendations (e.g. Disaster Risk Management, Environmental Code, etc.);
- 3. Ensure implementation of laws and policies, provide IEC, monitor and evaluate; and
- 4. Coordinate with all Regional Line Agencies to harmonize all efforts and help capacitate the identified LGUs.

B.4 Community Development TWG

The Balay Mindanaw Foundation Inc. shall act as the Chairperson of the Community Development TWG. Together with the Cagayan de Oro Social Welfare and Development as Co-Chairperson and the members (refer to the organizational structure), the TWG shall perform the following functions:

- 1. Ensure that all social processes are observed in the Council's programs and projects; and
- 2. Ensure that there is community participation in the Council's plans and programs

B.5 Communication/IEC TWG

The PIA-10 shall act as the Chairperson of the Communication/IEC TWG. Together with the Cagayan de Oro Press Club as Co-Chairperson and the members (refer to the organizational structure), the TWG shall perform the following functions:

- 1. Serve as the Central Information Unit of Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watershed Management Council which will facilitate preparation of the Integrated Communication Plan, Baselining of Knowledge, Skills, and Attitude;
- 2. Facilitate and monitor IEC activities; and
- 3. Gathering and sharing of IEC materials/plan should be in vernacular and cultural/gender sensitive.

B.6 Monitoring and Evaluation TWG

The NEDA-X shall act as the Chairperson of the Monitoring and Evaluation TWG. Together with the DILG-10 as the Co-Chairperson and members (refer to the Organizational Structure) the TWG shall perform the following functions:

- 1. Monitor the implementation of the ACCWMC Integrated Watershed Management Plan;
- 2. Utilize the Results-based Monitoring and Evaluation (RbME) to monitor the performance and evaluate short-term and long-term results of strategies, programs and projects for the development of the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watershed, including the Results Matrix tool to integrate outcome indicators to measure the success of implementation of the development strategies, programs, and projects.

C. THE SECTORAL GROUP

C.1. NATIONAL GOVERNMENT AGENCIES (NGAs) and GOVERNMENT-OWNED and CONTROLLED CORPORATIONs (GOCCs)

DENR-X

- Act as lead agency in the protection, development, rehabilitation, utilization, and management of the projects within the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds:
- 2. Coordinate with the LGUs, NGAs, NGOs, Academe, Religious Groups and other stakeholders in the continuous planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of projects and other activities geared toward the the sustainable development of Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds;
- 3. Facilitate the filing of criminal charges against violators of environmental and forestry laws within the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds;
- 4. Support to the sustainable operations of Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watershed Management Council (ACCWMC) and allocate funds for its operationalization;
- 5. Assist in the development of Manual of Operations for guidance of the Council;
- (6) Assign the Chief of the Conservation and Development Division, designated Regional Focal and Alternate Focal Persons and Watershed Coordinator of Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds to compose the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds Coordinating Office.
- 7. Serve as the secretariat of the Council.

NEDA - X

- 1. Provide technical advisory and promote strategies, programs, and projects for the development of the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watershed that are aligned with the Northern Mindanao Regional Development Plan 2023-2028;
- 2. Provide technical assistance in regional and urban development planning, and in preparing and updating of Provincial Development Physical Framework Plans and Comprehensive Land Use Plans of highly urbanized cities: and
- 3. Review and appraise proposed programs and projects for endorsement by the Regional Development Council-X.

DILG-X

- 1. Shall take the lead in the NGA-LGU planning and programming workshops; and
- 2. Provide technical assistance to identified LGUs on disaster preparedness related activities.

OCD - X

- 1. Provide oversight on matters related to Comprehensive National Civil Defense and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Program;
- 2. Provide capacity building training to Local Government Units on Rapid Damage and Needs Assessment (RDANA) and Post-disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA); and
- 3. Support to disaster preparedness initiatives of LGUs in the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds.

DOT-X

1. Provide oversight on matters related to Tourism Development for the cluster watersheds;

- 2. Develop river tourism programs such as White Water Rafting, Dragon Boat Race/Competition, River Cruise Tourism Development and others;
- 3. Assist in the development of Community-based Tourism Programs for riverside communities; and
- 4. Assist in river conservation efforts.

MinDA

- 1. Provide advisory role to the ACCWMC;
- 2. Provide technical assistance to the Council; and
- Assist in the fund mobilization and generation for the identified programs and projects as may be identified in the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds.

OTHER NGAs

Support the operation and strengthening of Agusan-Cugman Cluster Watersheds Management Council through the implementation of programs and projects geared towards the effective management and protection of the Watersheds through any of the following activities:

- 1. Assist and coordinate with major stakeholders in the identification and development of resettlement sites;
- 2. Assist in the implementation of reforestation project and river bank protection activities;
- 3. Provincial Development Physical Framework Plan (PDPFP);
- 4. Harmonize policies, gaps, overlaps and conflicts (e.g. DENR, NCIP, etc.);
- 5. Promote socio-economic programs/projects; and
- 6. Promote literacy programs especially in IP communities.

C.2. LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS

- 1. Provide technical assistance in the formulation/updating of Barangay Watershed Management Plan (BWMP);
- 2. Assist in the rehabilitation of all river tributaries within the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds;
- 3. Formulate supporting policies and ordinances relative to the sustainable management of Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds;
- 4. Assist in the enforcement of environmental and forestry laws in coordination with other stakeholders;
- 5. The City and Municipal Governments shall integrate the BWMP to the Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP); and
- 6. Whenever necessary and applicable, the BWMP as integrated in the CDP shall be integrated or given consideration in the Provincial Development and Physical Framework Plan (PDPFP).

C.3. NON-GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATIONS

- 1. Assist in the capacity building of communities through research, trainings, facilitation, information sharing, livelihood projects implementation, advocacy programs and fund sourcing; and
- 2. Advocate active protection and preservation of all resources within Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds.

AFP

1. Intensify patrol in the identified hot spot areas in coordination with DENR and other concerned agencies within the Area of Responsibility and provide availability of personnel.

PCG - District Northern Mindanao

1. Assist in the enforcement of maritime environmental laws, rules and regulations for the protection of Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds.

- 1. Initiate the conduct of Research and Development (R and D) projects/activities related to watersheds in coordination with the concerned agencies;
- 2. Initiate/assist in the conduct of Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) campaign;
- 3. Initiate community engagement;
- 4. Assist in designing a resource utilization fee scheme and the implementing mechanism; and
- 5. Integrate in the localization and contextualization of the curriculum implemented by schools located within and/or adjacent to the Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds the principles behind the ACCWMC and the affirmative actions implemented by its members.

C.9. BUSINESS SECTOR

1. Extend financial assistance in support of the sustainable management of Agusan-Cugman Cluster of Watersheds.

C.10. THE SOCIAL/PEOPLES ORGANIZATIONS

- 1. Help facilitate the concept of watershed management to IPs and farmers' organization;
- 2. Support and participate the implementation of projects for the preservation of Indigenous Knowledge System and Practices; and
- 3. Assist in the protection, development and conservation of various resources within the watershed; and

Section 4. Term of Office - The position of the Chairperson shall have a term of two (2) years. The DENR shall hold the Chairpersonship of the ACCWMC. In the case of clective LGU officials, whether Chairperson or members of the Council, the term of Office shall be co-terminus to his/her position. Once the term of Office of the incumbent expires, the next official shall assume the position.

Section 5. Effectivity. This Memorandum of Agreement shall take effect upon signing of the members herein. 



WHEREAS, LGU CDO, a highly urbanized city in Northern Mindanao, would like to collaborate with DOST-X and DEPED-X for the digital transformation of identified schools in

WHEREAS, DOST- X through its provincial office PSTO-Misamis Oriental has identified the provision of a smart educational technology needed by LGU CDO, which shall be undertaken through this project;

WHEREAS, DEPED- X through its CDO Division Office have recognized the transformational potential of adopting a smart educational technology to promote digitalization among public schools and enhance the security of students;

By integrating innovations in the delivery of critical government services (e.g. quality public education), operational bottlenecks are addressed, the delivery of service is more effective, efficient and equitable, and the government executives are provided with faster and more accurate information to come up with a data-driven decision.

This proposal aims to improve the delivery of quality education in two identified schools in Cagayan de Oro City by introducing a smart educational technology system, developed by a DOST-supported startup, to assist teachers in generating student performance reports. This will support LGU CDO's goal towards total digital transformation and eventually become a smart and sustainable city.

The said technology has been deployed in over 300 schools all over the country and abroad, mostly private schools. Given the maturity and high acceptability of the technology, the proposal will enable its pilot implementation in a public school setting to achieve the following objectives:

- a. To transfer the smart educational technology system developed by a DOST-supported startup;
- b. To digitize recording of academic reports, minimize redundancy of data input and reduce the number of needed grading forms to be filled-out by 75%;
- c. To enable real-time attendance tracking through an RFID system and mobile application; and
- d. To establish an effective, direct, and safe communication channel between teachers and parents through a mobile application.

(8) INTRODUCTION

In the rapidly evolving educational landscape of the 21st century, integrating technology in education is not just a luxury but a necessity, especially in the context of the Philippine public school system. The current situation in the Philippines, where teachers are heavily burdened with administrative tasks, underscores the urgent need for technological intervention. Each teacher is responsible for preparing at least 12 different spreadsheets per subject, which can consume up to two weeks for report preparation. This not only detracts from their core educational responsibilities but also impacts student development activities^[25].

Based on the report on the state of Philippine Education by the Philippine Business for Education (PBEd), lack of teacher support was identified as one of the primary reasons contributing to the dismal 2022 Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) ranking of the country. Teachers are unable to teach properly because they are forced to comply with other non-teaching requirements such as administrative reports and committee work.18

Moreover, relying on manual methods for managing voluminous reports leads to significant inefficiencies and increases the risk of mismanagement. In a country facing multiple risks like fires and flash floods, these inefficiencies also pose a severe threat to the security of physical records. The absence of a systematic attendance tracking method further exacerbates security concerns, leaving parents in the dark about their children's school attendance, a critical safety issuel¹³.

According to the Northern Mindanao Regional Development Plan (2023-2028), under Chapter 4: Promote Human Capital and Social Development, there is a need for DEPED to rationalize the workload of teachers. This means that the workload of teachers should mostly focus on teaching K-12 Most Essential Learning Competencies (MELCs) rather than the preparation of routinary, administrative, and special tasks. The document also provided strategies to attain this rationalization through hiring of more personnel, including administrative and non-teaching staff, and adoption of innovative technologies to improve the quality of teaching in public schools^[6]

RATIONALE/SIGNIFICANCE

Recent innovations in the field of educational technology offer transformative solutions to these challenges. For example, a DOST-supported technology from a Filipino-owned startup company was able to streamline the administrative processes of schools, reducing the paperwork of teachers by 75%. This system has already shown effectiveness in over 300 schools, significantly improving time efficiency. The time taken for academic report preparation is reduced from 14 days to an

average of just two days, and the adaptation period for schools to the platform is cut down by 93% compared to traditional methods.

The quality of education of a particular school is greatly affected by instructional quality. The rise of mandated paperwork and ancillary tasks among public school teachers poses a tangible risk of compromising teaching quality due to time and attention constraints. Furthermore, recent studies emphasize parental preference for real-time student tracking through the aid of technology. This proposal is poised to address and meet the said concern and opportunity through the deployment of a smart educational technology system at selected schools in Cagayan de Oro City. Based on the implementation of a similar technology in over 300 private schools in the country by a DOST-supported startup, teacher productivity was greatly improved, security of the students was enhanced, parents are more at peace knowing the real-time update of their children's activity in school, resulting in an overall improvement in the delivery of quality education. By streamlining administrative workflows and integrating real-time student tracking, this technology-driven solution aims to cultivate an environment conducive to learning and growth, particularly for public schools.

This proposal seeks to implement similar systems in Cagayan do Oro City to cut down the time needed for teachers to prepare grading reports and fortify student security through improved record-keeping and real-time attendance tracking. This will provide the teachers additional time to focus on their teaching and monitor the learning progress of students.

b. TECHNOLOGY IMPLEMENTATION

1. System Configuration

The first step will be system configuration to extract data and generate performance reports automatically. This will involve customizing the software to align with the school's current grading metrics and reporting standards. A set of algorithms will be developed to process grades, attendance, and other performance indicators to create comprehensive reports. The system will be integrated with the school's existing dalabases, ensuring a smooth transition and continuity of record-keeping. A testing phase will follow, where the accuracy of the reports generated will be compared against manually created ones to ensure the system's reliability.

2. Data Migration

To enhance the school's data management capabilities, a data migration strategy will be initiated to move existing student records to the configured system. Staff members will be trained on the new data entry protocols, emphasizing the importance of maintaining the integrity of the data. Additionally, a reliable data backup system will be put in place to secure all records against potential data loss scenarios, ensuring that the school has a robust data recovery process in place.

3. Process Streamlining

To address the significant amount of time currently required for report preparation, the processes will be streamlined. Custom templates pre-populating with student data will be designed for use within the developed system, cutting down on repetitive data entry. After initial deployment, monitoring and technology validation will be conducted to identify bottlenecks and make continuous improvements, ensuring that the time savings goals are met.

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4. RFID System Installation

Implementing the RFID system will be a multi-faceted process, starting with installing RFID readers at strategic points around the school. The system will then be programmed to log entries and exits in real time, immediately updating student attendance records. Notifications will be configured to alert parents and teachers of student movements, thus enhancing security and accountability.

5. Mabile App deployment

The development of a secure online portal and mobile app will grant parents timely access to their children's performance data. We will conduct hands on workshops to assist parents in setting up and navigating the system, emphasizing the available features and the type of information they can access. To support this initiative, a dedicated helpdesk will be established to provide technical assistance to parents, ensuring they can effectively engage with their children's educational progress and school activities.

6. Monitoring and Evaluation

The service provider will be required to put up a dedicated monitoring team with online chat support to ensure efficient implementation of the project. DOST 10, DEPED CDO and Regional Office, and LGU CDO shall also conduct independent monitoring and shall provide feedback for the continuous improvement of the implementation strategies.




Figure 1. Comparison of Report Generation using the Traditional Method and the Proposed Smart Education Technology System
