RESOLUTION

Before this committee is the Indorsement letter dated 30 May 2023 issued by Anderson A. Lo, Deputy Ombudsman for Mindanao, Office of the Ombudsman, Mindanao Station, regarding the complaint filed by Chuchi Eballe Acaso against Punong Barangay Julito D. Ogsimer, Barangay Kagawad Asperino N. Baconga, Barangay Kagawad Anthony B. Bustamante, and Barangay Kagawad Rowena Raye M. Mediana, all of Barangay Lapasan, Cagayan de Oro City before the Ombudsman under IC-OMC-23-0022. The said complaint was referred to this committee for the appropriate action with respect to the administrative aspect of the case.

On July 20, 2023, the committee conducted initial hearing of the instant case and the respondents were given 15 days to file their respective answer to the complaint.

On August 4, 2023, respondents filed their respective counter-affidavit and answer.

On the scheduled February 8, 2023 committee hearing, parties were given 30 days to submit their respective position paper, and thereafter, the instant case is submitted for resolution.

THE FACTS:

Stripped of non-essentials and as synthesized from the Complaint- Affidavit of Chuchi Eballe Acaso ("Chuchi") and Counter-Affidavits of Punong Barangay Julito D. Ogsimer ("Punong Barangay Ogsimer"), Barangay Kagawad Asperino N. Baconga (Kagawad Baconga), Barangay Kagawad Anthony B. Bustamante (Kagawad Bustamante), and Barangay Kagawad Rowena Raye M. Mediana (Kagawad Mediana), hereunder are the facts:

VERSION OF THE COMPLAINANT

Complainant Chuchi Eballe Acaso is a bonafide resident of Brgy. San Roque, Lapasan, Cagayan de Oro City. She is a liason staff of Gilda Go, whom Punong Barangay Ogsimer had personal loan transactions.

On February 4, 2019, at around 11:00 am, complainant Chuchi went to the barangay hall of Barangay Lapasan, to collect the payment of the loans from Punong Barangay Ogsimer. Respondents Barangay Kagawads Baconga, Bustamante, and Mediana approached Chuchi and asked if they can avail a loan from Gilda Go's mother, Trinidad Go. Punong Barangay Ogsimer handed a letter (using barangay Lapasan's letterhead), which was duly signed by respondents and addressed to Mrs. Trining Go, to Chuchi.

In the said letter, respondents intended to borrow money in the amount of P2.4 million from Mrs. Trining Go for the payment of the salaries of the barangay employees because the release of the Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) of the barangay was on March 2019.

On the same day, a check was issued by Trinidad Go in the amount of P2.4 million in the name of respondent Punong Barangay Ogsimer.

Despite repeated demands, respondents Punong Barangay Ogsimer and Barangay Kagawads Baconga, Bustamante, and Mediana, failed to pay the loan. Respondent Punong Barangay Ogsimer even issued a check for the payment of the loan, however, the said check was dishonored by the drawee bank as the account was already closed.

VERSION OF THE RESPONDENT

Respondent Ogsimer interposed denial of the allegation of the complaint and countered that there was no loan transaction in the amount of P2.4 million was entered by Barangay Lapasan with Mrs. Trining Go. Consequently, barangay Lapasan neither received favour nor burdened with obligations, sustained injury, disadvantages, and damages of whatever kind.

On the other hand, respondents Barangay Kagawad Baconga, Bustamante, and Mediana also denied the allegations of the complaint and advanced that the check in the amount of P2.4 million was issued for Punong Barangay Ogsimer's personal loan transaction and not for barangay Lapasan. Thus, no loan transaction was entered by the barangay and Trining Go.

THE RULING OF THE COMMITTEE

The instant administrative case is filed by Chuchi Eballe Acaso against Barangay officials of Brgy. Lapasan, Cagayan de Oro City, namely, Punong Barangay Julito D. Ogsimer, Barangay Kagawad Asperino N. Baconga, Barangay Kagawad Anthony B. Bustamante, and Barangay Kagawad Rowena Raye M. Mediana, for Violation of

Section 3, paragraph e and g, of Republic Act No. 3019, Dishonesty, Grave Misconduct, Conduct Unbecoming of a Public Officer, Abuse of Authority, and Republic Act 7160 of the Local Government Code.

In Primo C. Miro v. Marilyn Mendoza V da. De Erederos, et. al.,¹ the Supreme Court held:

Substantial evidence, quantum of proof in administrative cases

Substantial evidence is defined as such amount of relevant evidence which a reasonable mind might accept as adequate to support a conclusion. It is more than a mere scintilla of evidence 22 The standard of substantial evidence is satisfied when there is reasonable ground to believe, based on the evidence submitted, that the respondent is responsible for the misconduct complained of. It need not be overwhelming or preponderant, as is required in an ordinary civil case 23 or evidence beyond reasonable doubt, as is required in criminal cases, but the evidence must be enough for a reasonable mind to support a conclusion.

The burden to establish the charges rests upon the complainant. The case should be dismissed for lack of merit if the complainant fails to show in a satisfactory manner the facts upon which his accusations are based. The respondent is not even obliged to prove his exception or defense.²

To prove that respondent Punong Barangay Ogsimer, Barangay Kagawads Baconga, Bustamante, and Mediana are administratively liable for Violation of Section 3, paragraph e and g, of Republic Act No. 3019, Dishonesty, Grave Misconduct, Conduct Unbecoming of a Public Officer, Abuse of Authority, and Republic Act 7160 of the Local Government Code, complainant Chuchi attached to his affidavitcomplaint the following documentary evidence, viz:

a. Letter dated February 4, 2019 bearing a Barangay Lapasan letterhead and signed by the respondents, showing that the respondents barangay officials issued a letter to influence Trinidad Go to grant the P2.4M loan;

b. BDO Check No. 0000938379 issued to Julito Ogsimer in the amount of P2,400,000.00, showing that Trinidad Go approved the loan by respondents and issued a corresponding check;

c. Demand Letter dated September 7, 2021, addressed to respondents, showing that Trinidad Go demanded payment from the respondents;

d. Notice of Dishonor and Demand for payment dated December 19, 2022, showing that the check issued by respondent Ogsimer to Trinidad Go for the payment of the P2.4M loan was dishonored by the drawee bank for being a closed account;

To corroborate the allegation in the complaint, complainant Chuchi presented the affidavit of Sheryl T. Adajar, the barangay record officer of the barangay at the time of the alleged February 4, 2019 transaction.

Violation of Section 3, paragraph e and g, of Republic Act No. 3019

Sections 3 (e) and (g) of RA 3019 state:

Section 3. Corrupt practices of public officers. - In addition to acts or omissions of public officers already penalized by existing law, the following shall constitute corrupt practices of any public officer and are hereby declared to be unlawful:

хххх

(e) Causing any undue injury to any party, including the Government, or giving any private party any unwarranted benefit, advantage or preference in the discharge of his official administrative or judicial functions through manifest partiality, evident bad faith or gross inexcusable negligence. This provision shall apply to officers and employees of offices or government corporations charged with the grant of licenses or permits or other concessions;

xxxx

(g) Entering, on behalf of the Government, into any contract or transaction manifestly and grossly disadvantageous to the same, whether or not the public officer profited or will profit thereby.

The elements of violation of Section 3(c) of RA 3019 are:

(a) That the accused must be a public officer discharging administrative, judicial, or official functions, or a private individual acting in conspiracy with such public officers;

(b) That he acted with manifest partiality, evident bad faith, or inexcusable negligence; and

(c) That his action caused any undue injury to any party, including the government, or giving any private party unwarranted benefits, advantage, or preference in the discharge of his functions.³

The elements of violation of Section 3(f) of RA 3019 are:

(a) The offender is a public officer;

(b) The said officer has neglected or has refused to act without sufficient justification after due demand or request has been made on him;

(c) Reasonable time has elapsed from such demand or request without the public officer having acted on the matter pending before him; and

(d) Such failure to so act is for the purpose of obtaining, directly or indirectly, from any person interested in the matter some pecuniary or material benefit or advantage in favor of an interested party, or discriminating against another.⁴

After carefully evaluating the attendant circumstances and the evidence adduced by both parties, the Committee finds that the above-cited elements are wanting in the instant case.

Upon cursor examination of the documentary evidence presented by complainant Chuchi, it shows that there was a loan transaction and non-payment of the same. First, the letter dated February 4, 2019, shows that respondents requested for a loan with Trinidad Go. Second, Trinidad Go issued BDO Check No. 0000938379 in the amount of P2.4 million in the name of Julito Ogsimer. Third, Trinindad Go sent a demand letter dated September 7, 2021 to Punong Barangay Ogsimer for the payment of the latter's loan. Lastly, Trinidad Go sent a notice of dishonor and demand for payment dated December 19, 2022 to Punong Barangay Ogsimer because the latter's check was dishonored by the drawee bank.

The evidence of the complainant would show that the P2.4 million loan obtained from Trinidad Go was a personal transaction of respondent Ogsimer. Trinidad Go issued a personal check in the said amount in the name of respondent Ogsimer; and after 2 years, Trinidad Go demanded payment of the loan from respondents. Clearly, Trinidad Go wanted to collect the P2.4 million from respondent Ogsimer because the latter obtained the loan in his personal capacity and not for the barangay.

There is nothing in the records would show that Barangay Lapasan entered into a contract of loan with Trinidad Go. The BDO Check No. 0000938379 in the amount of P2.4 million in the name of Julito Ogsimer reveals that the loan was issued to the latter and not to the barangay. Neither the barangay suffered any injury or damage caused by the loan entered by the respondent Ogsimer from Trinidad Go. Thus, the committee will no longer delve into the facts whether the act of respondents constitute corrupt practices of under RA 3019 as the transaction entered into by respondents are purely in in their personal capacity.

Furthermore, the instant complaint against the respondents was filed to politically malign respondent Ogsimer during his candidacy for Punong Barangay in the 2023 SK and Barangay elections. Records reveals that the complaint of Chuchi was filed before the ombudsman on March 23, 2023, seven (7) months before the October 2023 SK and Barangay elections.⁵On the other hand, complainant Chuchi was running for barangay kagawad against the group of respondent Ogsimer. The animosity between complainant and respondent Ogsimer was used to destroy the credibility of respondent Ogsimer, as evidence by a text message from complainant for respondent Ogsimer. In fact, the proper party file of the instant case is Mrs. Trinidad Go. Trinidad Go, suffered damage because of the non-payment of the loan obtained by respondents. It would clearly shows that the filing of the instant complaint is tainted with malice to politically attack the respondents.

In sum, the evidence at hand is insufficient to prove the administrative liability of the respondents.

Dishonesty, Grave Misconduct, Conduct Unbecoming of a Public Officer, Abuse Of Authority, and RA 7160 of the Local Government Code

The allegation in the complaint failed to sufficiently established that the respondents acted with dishonesty, misconduct, conduct unbecoming of a public officer and even abuse of authority. The complaint affidavit of Chuchi merely alleged on the loan obtained by respondents from Trinidad Go and the same was not paid. The failure of respondent Ogsimer and barangay Kagawads to the pay the loan is a matter involving civil obligation. Thus, the instant case is purely civil in nature.

In fine, the complainant has the burden of proving by substantial evidence the allegations in her complaint. The basic rule is that mere allegation is not evidence and is not equivalent to proof. In the present case, there is no sufficient, clear and convincing evidence to hold Punong Barangay Julito D. Ogsimer, Barangay Kagawad Asperino N. Baconga, Barangay Kagawad Anthony B. Bustamante, and Barangay Kagawad Rowena Raye M. Mediana are administratively liable for Violation of Section 3, paragraph e and g, of Republic Act No. 3019, Dishonesty, Grave Misconduct, Conduct Unbecoming of a Public Officer, Abuse of Authority, and Republic Act 7160 of the Local Government Code.

WHEREFORE, premises considered, the instant case is ordered dismissed for lack of merit.



Civil Service Commission Memorandum Circular No. 6 series 2023 which took effect last August 12, 2023 amends Section 34 of the 2017 Omnibus Rules on Appointments and Other Human Resource Actions (ORAOHRA). Specifically, paragraph d. provides the following, quoted hereunder;

"d. The QS for department head and assistant department head positions created by the local sanggunian through an Ordinance which are not included in RA No. 7160 or other special laws may be those approved by the CSC through a Resolution..."

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This circular requires, before a department head/assistant department head created by the Sanggunian, be filled-up, to have an approved qualification standards (QS) from the Civil Service Commission.

CITY GOVERNMENT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO, a government agency created and organized under existing laws, with principal address at 89 Hayes St., CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY, 9000, Misamis Oriental represented herein by its Honorable Mayor, **ROLANDO "KLAREX" UY**, hereinafter referred to as **"LGU-CDO."**

WITNESSETH: That

WHEREAS, the State values the dignity of every human person and guarantees fully respect for human rights and mandates that all educational institutions shall inculcate patriotism and nationalism foster respect for human rights, appreciation of the role of national heroes in the historical development of the country, and teach the rights and duties of citizenship:

WHEREAS, under the UN Declaration on Human Rights Education and Training as well as the World Programme for Human Rights Education, State institutions have the obligation to undertake a continuing program of human rights education and training to mold the Filipino psyche along respect for and protection of all human rights;

WHEREAS, CHR is an independent constitutional body mandated to establish a continuing program of research, education, and information to enhance respect for the primacy of human rights, and in pursuance of this function, and, for that purpose, may coordinate and request the assistance of any department, bureau, or agency;

WHEREAS, LGU-CDO has a higher education institution called the CITY COLLEGE OF CAGAYAN DE ORO (CCCDO) existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Philippines, with principal address at Zone 2, Barangay Agusan, Cagayan de Oro City;

WHEREAS, CITY COLLEGE OF CAGAYAN DE ORO will be the primary institution to provide education and training to the identified faculty, staff, and students, to obtain greater opportunity in upholding human dignity, and thereby improve their welfare and guarantee and safeguard human rights.

WHEREAS, CHR encourages all State Universities and Colleges and private Higher Education Institutions to establish their Centers for Human Rights Education as their main mechanisms in helping accelerate the building of a culture of human rights in the academic communities and in their geographic areas of jurisdiction where they operate;

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NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing premises, the parties hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE I PURPOSE AND SCOPE

Section 1. The purpose of this MOA is to set forth the terms and conditions, scope of work and responsibilities of the parties associated with their collaboration on the establishment, development, strengthening, and continuous operationalization of a Center for Human Rights Education (CHRE).

CHR has unique expertise and experience in the following areas: (1) human rights education and training, and (2) provision of preventive measures and legal aid services to the underprivileged whose human rights have been violated or need.

LGU-CDO has unique expertise and experience in the following areas: instruction, curriculum, research, and community engagements.

ARTICLE II GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. The PARTIES, through their respective representatives designated herein, shall be the partners under this MOA.

Section 2. This partnership mainly aims to build a culture of human rights by establishing, developing, strengthening, and continuously operating the Center for Human Rights Education, herein referred to as CHRE, at the City College of Cagayan de Oro to undertake human rights education activities, involving its faculty, staff, and students as may be applicable within its campus and with its partners and clienteles through instruction, research, and community extension activities.

Section 3. This partnership further aims to develop the CHRE as a social laboratory for human rights education innovations and in building a culture of human rights in various community settings.

Section 4. The PARTIES acknowledge that CHR is the National Human Rights Institution (NHRI) created under the 1987 Constitution exercising jurisdiction over the entire Philippines accredited by the Global Alliance of National Human Rights Institution (GANHRI) as Status "A."

Section 5. Each party takes legal and financial responsibility for the actions of its respective employees, officers, agents, representatives, and volunteers. Each party agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other to the fullest extent permitted by law from and against any and all demands, claims, actions, liabilities, losses, damages, and costs, including reasonable attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from the indemnifying party's acts or omissions related to its participation under this MOA and each party shall bear the proportionate cost of any damages attributable to the fault of such party, its officers, agents, employees, and independent contractors. It is the intention of the parties that, where fault is determined to have been contributory, principles of comparative fault will be applied.

Each party, at its sole cost and expense, shall carry insurance or self-insure to covers its activities in connection with this MOA, and obtain, keep in force and maintain, insurance, or equivalent programs of self-insurance, for general liability, workers compensation and business automobile liability adequate to cover its potential liabilities.

ARTICLE III SPECIFIC AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY

Section 1. LGU-CDO shall, through the City College of Cagayan de Oro shall:

- Establish a CHRE located within the campus and accessible by clienteles through an appropriate office address;
- Designate a Center Director or Coordinator to manage the CHRE, assisted by a secretariat;
- 3. Identify individual persons for capacity building as human rights educators;
- Launch the CHRE to make known to the general public and its clienteles and provide support to its programs, projects, and activities;
- 5. Deigned the CHRE, which shall perform the following functions:

Instruction:

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- Take leadership in receiving the HEI's curricula and courses for the purpose of mainstreaming human rights concepts and principles, and integrate human rights concepts and participation as curricula;
- b. Organize a core of human rights educators as volunteers of the Center and human rights educators training and accreditation with the regional office;
- Conduct human rights education activities for its students, faculty, staff, and community clienteles on its own or in partnership with the CHR regional office and other relevant multi-stakeholder partners;
- d. Develop curricula and instructional materials for formal, non-formal, and/or alternative delivery systems of education for human rights; and,
- e. Develop information, education, and communication (IEC) materials on human rights.

Research

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- Conduct research and special studies to enhance human rights education programs; and
- Publish research and share reports with the CHR Regional Office to assist in the effective monitoring and evaluation of the state actors' compliance with obligations in international treaties on human rights;

Extension

- a. Assist in the establishment and capacity-building of Barangay Human Rights Action Centers (BHRACs) within its jurisdiction; and
- b. Develop programs and activities that address the needs and concerns of vulnerable sectors in the community they operate.

Section 2. CHR shall:

Develop information education and communication (IEC) materials and standard training modules on human rights, access to justice and rule of law that can be used, reproduced and/or disseminated by **LGU-CDO**:

- Provide technical support in the development and implementation of the human rights programs, projects, and activities of LGU-CDO;
- Assist in the establishment and operationalization of the CHRE and the capacity-building of its staff and volunteers as well as faculty and student organizations;
- Jointly organize the capacity-building activities for its multi-stakeholder partners such as, but not limited to, educators and civil society organizations;
- Provide technical support to the LGU-CDO in helping the CHR establish and capacitate HRACs within its jurisdiction;
- e. Provide and share with the LGU-CDO modules, together with all learning resources included in the modules, and other materials on Human Rights Education, if so requested, or access thereto; and
- f. Jointly organize with the LGU-CDO capacity-building activities for its multistakeholder partners, such as but not limited to, human rights action teams, and civil society organizations.

Section 3. The PARTIES shall each be solely responsible for any and all costs associated with their responsibilities under this MOA.

Section 4. LGU-CDO, even after lapse of this MOA, shall not perform any act that will be inimical or cause any adverse effect to CHR, in particular, but not limited to, the FIRST PARTY's status as the NHRI of the Philippines, its mandate, powers, jurisdiction, or its accreditation with the GANHRI as Status "A".

Section 5. The PARTIES agree that any intellectual property, which is jointly developed through activities covered under this MOA, can be used by either party for non-commercial human rights education and promotion purposes without obtaining consent from the other, unless later modified in writing.

All other intellectual property used in the implementation of the MOA will remain the property of the party that provided it. This property can be used by either party for purposes covered by the MOA but consent will be obtained from the owner of the property before using it for purposes not covered by the MOA.

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ARTICLE IV MONITORING REQUIREMENT

Section 1. CHR shall be responsible for monitoring and evaluation, and for organizing quarterly or semestral meetings, or as the need may arise, to provide technical assistance and for monitoring and evaluation purposes.

Section 2. LGU-CDO shall submit quarterly reports to the concerned CHR Regional Office to ensure compliance with the stated areas of responsibility covered under this MOA.

The quarterly reports shall be submitted following CHRE reporting templates which shall be provided by the **CHR**.

ARTICLE V DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Section 1. All disputes, controversies, or claims arising out of or relating to this MOA shall first be mutually resolved.

Provided, further, that parties hereby agree to resolve a dispute through informal discussions or settle any issue amicably before exercising the right to terminate.

ARTICLE VI AMENDMENTS AND EFFECTIVITY

Section 1. This MOA shall be effective upon the date of the last party to sign this MOA below and shall remain in effect for a period of three (3) years from that date unless earlier terminated. The parties indicate agreement with this MOA by their signatures below.

The MOA may be renewed at the end of this period by mutual written agreement by both parties. The provisions of this MOA may only be amended or waived by mutual written agreement by both Parties.

The individuals signing this MOA on behalf of their respective entities represent and warrant (without personal liability thereof) that upon the signature of each, this MOA shall have been duly executed by the entity each represents.

Section 2. This MOA may be terminated by mutual agreement of the parties upon serving notice to the other party within sixty (60) days and shall automatically terminate upon completion of all responsibilities as stated herein, unless otherwise amended.



MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into by and between:

The CITY GOVERNMENT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO, represented by the City Mayor, HON. ROLANDO "KLAREX" A. UY, duly authorized for this purpose, with office located at 2nd Floor Executive Bldg., City Hall, Cagayan de Oro City (hereinafter referred to as the "LGU CDO");

-and-

1 AND ALL TECHNICAL SCHOOL, INC., represented by the MS. MARIA JOCELYN N. CO, School President, with office address at Vamenta Boulevard, Carmen, Cagayan de Oro City, hereinafter referred to as "TVI").

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, the LGU CDO is committed to providing educational opportunities and skills training to its residents through various scholarship programs to enhance employment prospects and support local industries;

WHEREAS, the TVI is a reputable learning service provider specializing in technical and vocational training, and is capable of delivering industry-relevant skills and knowledge to scholarship recipients;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE I PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOA is to outline the terms and conditions under which the LGU CDO and the TVI will collaborate to implement the Relevant Industry Skills for Employment (RISE) Scholarship Program. This program aims to provide qualified residents of Cagayan de Oro with technical vocational training, culminating in the awarding of National Certificates (NC I and NC II).

ARTICLE II ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Section 1. The LGU CDO, through the Office of the City Education and Development Officer-City Scholarships Office ("CSO"), agrees to:

- 1. Administer the RISE TVET program and shoulder the training cost and national assessment fees of at least one (1) batch (25 scholarship slots) of trainees;
- 2. Ensure that scholarship recipients meet the following qualifications:

- a. Endorsed by the TVI;
- b. Resident of Cagayan de Oro;
- c. Registered with the COMELEC;
- d. Classified as indigent.
- 3. Facilitate the endorsement process for qualified candidates;
- 4. Promote awareness of the training programs within the community through various communication channels to ensure that potential beneficiaries are informed;
- 5. Monitor the progress and performance of the scholarship recipients;
- 6. Require scholarship recipients to complete return service on CSO-approved events and activities;
- 7. Establish a feedback mechanism to gather input from trainees about their training experiences and outcomes, and use this information to improve future training programs;
- 8. Collaborate with other government agencies, non-governmental organizations, and private sector partners to support the training and employment of trainees.

Section 2. TVI agrees to:

- 1. Provide a training program for in demand and hard-to-fill skills;
- Manage the enrollment of trainees, including the accurate and timely input of all required information into the TESDA Training Management Information System (T2MIS);
- 3. Ensure the program meets industry standards and includes hands-on training in collaboration with partner industries;
- 4. Ensure 100% completion and certification rate of trainees;
- 5. Ensure 100% employment rate of completers within 6 months from training completion;
- 6. Ensure that the training programs are conducted in a timely manner and completed within the agreed schedule;
- 7. Facilitate, process and endorse the assessment and certification of trainees upon completion of the training programs;
- 8. Integrate industry trends and technological advancements in the programs;
- 9. Maintain high standards of training delivery to ensure the competency and employability of graduates;
- 10. Hire qualified and competent instructors who meet TESDA's certification requirements;
- 11. Ensure that training facilities and equipment meet TESDA's minimum requirements and industry standards;
- 12. Maintain and upgrade equipment to provide trainees with hands-on experience using current technologies;
- 13. Maintain accurate records of trainees' attendance, performance, and assessment results
- 14. Facilitate on-the-job training (OJT), Supervised Industry Learning (SIL), and employment opportunities for trainees through industry linkages;
- 15. Provide guidance and counseling services to support trainees' personal and professional development;

- 16. Provide periodic reports to the LGU CDO on the progress and performance of the scholarship recipients;
- 17. Pay for the assessment fees of trainees and bill the LGU at the end of the assessment. Per capita cost must not exceed TESDA's promulgated schedule of cost of the year of implementation.

ARTICLE III: MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 3: No Employer-Employee Relationship. This MOA does not create an employer-employee relationship between the LGU CDO and the TVI or the scholarship recipients.

Section 4: Right to Revoke, Revise, Amend or Rescind. The Parties reserve the right to revoke, revise, amend, or rescind this MOA upon mutual agreement, provided that such changes are made in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.

Section 5: **Confidentiality.** The Parties agree to keep all information and data exchanged or created under this MOA confidential and shall not be disclosed to anyone unless expressly given consent by the data subject. The Parties agree to strictly observe the Data Privacy Act and be bound by the Data Sharing Agreement, herein attached as Annex "A", and made an integral part of this MOA.

Section 6: Duration. This partnership shall initially run for one (1) year from effectivity and may be renewed after successful review and evaluation of all Parties.

Section 7: Amendment. Any amendments to this MOA shall be made in writing and require the consent of all Parties.

Section 8: Termination. Any party may terminate this agreement with a written notice to the other parties at least three (3) months prior to the program completion of the existing batch. All parties shall ensure the orderly completion of ongoing activities and the arrangement or return of any shared resources.

Section 9: **Dispute Resolution.** In case of dispute between the Parties arising out of or relating to this Agreement, the Parties agree to exert efforts to amicably settle the same. Failing at which, the dispute shall be brought for resolution by the proper courts of Cagayan de Oro City, to the exclusion of all other venues.

Section 10. Effectivity. This agreement shall take effect immediately upon signing by all parties concerned and shall remain in force unless sooner terminated by mutual consent of the parties, in writing.

DATA SHARING AGREEMENT

This **Data Sharing Agreement (DSA)** is entered into by and between the **CITY GOVERNMENT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO (LGU-CDO)** and **1 AND ALL TECHNICAL SCHOOL, INC. (TVI)** to establish the content, use, and protection of data provided between the Parties in relation to the implementation of the Relevant Industry Skills for Employment-Technical and Vocational Education and Training (RISE-TVET) Scholarship Program.

I. Term

This Agreement shall be in effect for one (1) year in accordance with the term of the Memorandum of Agreement to which this Data Sharing Agreement is made an integral part.

II. Intended Use of Data

The following are the intended uses of the shared data:

- a. Student Identification, control, verification and screening
- b. Grouping or classification
- c. Statistical processing
- d. Conducting research for improvement of students' learning

III. Limitations on the use of data

Data disclosed by the scholars/students to or collected on behalf of either Party is the property of the Collecting Party, and shall only be used for the above-stated purposes and shall not be shared with third parties without the written permission/consent of the First/Second Party, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro and data subject/s.

Such data shall not be sold or used, internally or externally, and for any other purpose not directly related to services provided by the Parties in this Agreement without the written permission of the First/Second Party, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro and data subject/s.

IV. Data Security

Both parties shall exercise at least the same degree of care it uses with its own personal data and confidential information, but in no event less than reasonable care, to protect the personal data from misuse and unauthorized access or disclosure. It shall adapt reasonable administrative, physical, and technical measures to prevent loss, misuse and alteration of the information under its control.

V. Data Elements

Personal information shared between the Parties shall be limited to the data elements specifically defined and authorized by each Party. If the other Party needs to collect additional data, its authorized personnel must submit a request in writing to the other Party. Under no circumstances shall any Party collect any information classified as Sensitive or Confidential without the express written approval of the First/Second Party, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro and the data subject/s.

The data to be shared or collected shall be limited to the following elements:

- a. Scholar's/Student's Name (First Name, Middle Name/Initial, Last Name)
- b. Birthdate
- c. Age
- d. Gender
- e. Address
- f. COMELEC Registration
- g. Indigency Classification
- h. Contact Number and/or email address

Each party shall be responsible for securing consent from the patients to collect personal information and share these with the Other Party for referral purposes.

VI. Data Privacy Training

When there is an opportunity for the same, both Parties shall avail of any training for its personnel on internal security policies and procedures and on the Data Privacy Act, its Implementing Rules and Regulations, and National Privacy Commission Issuances to protect personal data.

VII. Breach Management

a. *Report.* Within twenty-four (24) hours of becoming aware of the unauthorized use or disclosure of the personal data or any security incident or possible security breach, the concerned Party shall promptly report the fact to the other party who shared the personal data. Both parties, shall, within seventy-two (72) hours from such occurrence, notify the National Privacy Commission and the concerned data subject in accordance with NPC Circular 16-03.

b. *Cooperation and Mitigation*. Both parties shall cooperate with any mediation that is necessary to:

- 1. Address any applicable reporting requirements, and
- 2. Mitigate any effects of such unauthorized use or disclosure of personal data or any security incident or possible security breach.

VIII. Amendments and Alterations to this Agreement

Parties may amend this Agreement by mutual consent, in writing, at any time.

IX. Termination of Services

In the event that the MOA is terminated, the other Party shall return to the Collecting Party, all data collected in the course of the MOA.

- 6. Ensure that the training programs are conducted in a timely manner and completed within the agreed schedule;
- 7. Facilitate, process and endorse the assessment and certification of trainees upon completion of the training programs;
- 8. Integrate industry trends and technological advancements in the programs;
- 9. Maintain high standards of training delivery to ensure the competency and employability of graduates;
- 10. Hire qualified and competent instructors who meet TESDA's certification requirements;

- 9. Maintain high standards of training delivery to ensure the competency and employability of graduates;
- 10. Hire qualified and competent instructors who meet TESDA's certification requirements;

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DATA SHARING AGREEMENT

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17. Pay for the assessment fees of trainees and bill the LGU at the end of the assessment. Per capita cost must not exceed TESDA's promulgated schedule of cost of the year of implementation.

ARTICLE III: MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 3: No Employer-Employee Relationship. This MOA does not create an employer-employee relationship between the LGU CDO and the TVI or the scholarship recipients.

Section 4: **Right to Revoke, Revise, Amend or Rescind.** The Parties reserve the right to revoke, revise, amend, or rescind this MOA upon mutual agreement, provided that such changes are made in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.



KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is entered into by and between:

The CITY GOVERNMENT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO, a local government unit, created and operating under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with office address at Executive House, City Hall Compound, and duly represented herein by its City Mayor, HON. WHEREAS, CDO-LGU, under the present administration, considers Education as an empowering tool in the collective efforts for human development and a crucial component under its RISE Agenda;

WHEREAS, LGU-CDO, CU, and DepED-CDO are concerned about providing quality education as a right of every Filipino child;

WHEREAS, LGU-CDO, CU, and DepED-CDO believe in increasing the number of out-of-school youth, and adults who can complete formal basic education;

ARTICLE I PURPOSE

The purpose of this agreement is to establish a partnership to implement the Alternative Learning System-Night School Program (ALS-NSP), providing out-of-school youth and adults at risk in Cagayan de Oro with opportunities for formal basic education, literacy, numeracy, and values formation. The ALS-NSP aims to empower these individuals, reintegrate them into the education system, or prepare them for the Accreditation and Equivalency (A&E) examination, supporting sustainable development. This collaboration aligns with the RISE Agenda of LGU-CDO, emphasizing education as a key tool for human development, and defines the roles and responsibilities of each party for effective program delivery and support.

ARTICLE II ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Section 1. LGU-CDO shall:

- Designate the Office of the City Education and Development Officer to mobilize the following:
 - i. Assignment of a focal person to coordinate smooth implementation of the program;
 - Coordination with relevant stakeholders for access to flexible learning options and delivery of educational programs that provide basic literacy and numeracy skills, vocational training, and life skills to the targeted clientele;
 - Partnerships and/or engagement with other stakeholders who may be able to offer apprenticeships and internships that provide hands-on experience;
 - iv. Access to mentors and counselors who can offer guidance, support and motivation;
 - Advocate for policies that support inclusive education, vocational training, and employment opportunities for out-of-school youth and adults at risk;
 - vi. Foster partnerships between government agencies, non-profits, educational institutions, and the private sector to create a comprehensive support network;
 - vii. Provision of tertiary and vocational education scholarships to qualified NSP beneficiaries/completers;
 - vili. Provision of certification of list of beneficiaries;
 - ix. Provision of Five Thousand (PhP5,000.00) worth of Financial Assistance per learner categorized as *Children in Conflict with the Law* (CICL) endorsed by the Office of the City Social Welfare and Development Officer, which will be channeled to the partner learning institution. The coverage of the operational support shall be for learning materials and modules, load allowance, transportation allowance, meal allowance, supplemental food packs, uniform, and ALS-NSP ID among other miscellaneous costs;

x. Provision of One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (Php 1, 500) worth of Financial Assistance per learner from other categories, such as laborers, street and market vendors, tricycle drivers, porters, single mothers, dispatchers, and other marginalized sectors. This assistance will be channeled to the partner learning institution and shall be intended for uniform, ID, insurance, learning materials, and other miscellaneous and operational costs;

- Convene the quarterly partnership meeting and serve as Secretariat for the program's monitoring, assessment, evaluation and feedback mechanisms;
- xii. Provide documentation reports or best practices for the program's successful implementation.
- Cause the Office of the City Social Welfare and Development Officer to designate one (1) CSWD personnel to ensure social welfare responsiveness to the program's clientele, to wit:
 - i. Assess and certify individuals needing help and manage cases of the program's beneficiaries/clientele/learners;
 - Endorse clients to partner schools, concerned LGU department/offices, and and stakeholders who may be able to assist them finish at least basic education, gain employable skills, and land a job;
 - iii. Provide psycho-social consultation services to the learners;
 - iv. Organize outreach activities to identify children, youth, and adults at risk and connect them with available resources;
 - v. Mobilize critical quick response mechanism on man-made or natural disaster in humanitarian/emergency settings (flood, fire, earthquake, epidemic/pandemic crises) and provide legal assistance directly to highly vulnerable learners;
 - vi. Provide the required family interventions for parent-learners.
- c. Cause the Office of the Oro Youth Development Officer to carry out the following:
 - i. Arrange for safe spaces where youths at risk can gather for learning, socialization, and support;
 - ii. Proactively map and engage the out-of-school and maintain a database of their profile and needs;
 - iii. Assist the Oro Youth Center in its duty as a drop-in and referral center for the youth with problems such as teenage pregnancy, teenage prostitution, sexually transmitted disease/infection, boyfriend-girlfriend relationship concerns, parent-child relationship concerns, substance abuse, vagrancy and other anti-social behavior such truancy and vandalism, and other adolescent-related problems;

- iv. Include ALS-NSP beneficiaries in their programs and activities that promote a broad understanding of the problems affecting the youth in highly urbanized areas;
- v. Assign a focal person for the ALS-NSP.

Section 2. CU shall:

- Designate a program officer or focal person for the ALS-NSP;
- b. Partner with DepED-CDO-ALS in the orientation and capacity development for ALS volunteer/pre-service teachers;
- c. Promote the enrolment of preferred target beneficiaries within the adapted communities and submit the certificate of admission after three months of the commencement of classes to LGU-CDO through the Office of the City Education and Development Officer-City Scholarships Office;
- d. Mobilize student tutors or pre-service teachers who will handle supplementat activities and assist in values formation sessions;
- Co-facilitate the necessary orientation, capacity development, and guidelines for the ALS-NSP volunteers/pre-service teachers and student tutors;
- f. Provide classrooms for the use of the learning sessions;
- g. Permit ALS-NSP to use college/university facilities such as audio-visual rooms, theaters, ICT laboratories, and other learning facilities that will improve learners' learning;
- h. Monitor the conduct of the ALS-NSP classes;
- i. Ensure the safe environment of the ALS-NSP learners;
- j. Secure the permit from the CU Security Office for the entrance, stay, and exit procedures of the ALS-NSP learners;
- k. Provide uniform and identification cards for the bonafide learners;
- I. Reproduce ALS-NSP learning modules and materials for the learners;
- Consult with the ALS-NSP teacher on the progress and performance of the learners;
- Assist completers with the needed documents for the A&E exam;
- Hold the graduation rites of the A&E passers;
- Assist A&E passers with educational and/or technical vocational opportunities and the DepEd voucher program;

- Provide a financial report on all funds raised for the program, in cash or in-kind;
- r. Conduct annual evaluation of the program with partners and stakeholders; and
- s. Submit the year-end report to be submitted to the DepEd CDO and LGU-CDO.

Section 3. DepEd CDO shall:

- Recognize CU as a satellite center/provider for ALS;
- b. Assign ALS mobile teacher/s;
- c. Facilitate the enrolment in the Learner Information System (LIS) and provide certificate of enrolment to LGU-CDO through the Office of the City Education and Development Officer-City Scholarships Office;
- d. Provide the ALS mobile teacher with assistance in conducting the learning sessions;
- e. Facilitate the necessary orientation, capacity development, and guidelines for the ALS-NSP Teacher and ALS-NSP volunteer/pre-service teachers;
- f. Provide ALS learning resources and modules;
- g. Allow access to ALS documents such as curriculum guide, learning activity sheets (LAS), tools, and templates for references;
- Provide input on the direction, curriculum, and A&E examination schedule;
- i. Monitor the conduct of the ALS-NSP classes;
- j. Advise the schedule of the Presentation Portfolio Assessment (PPA) for the ALS-NSP learners; and
- k. Participate in the evaluation of the program.

ARTICLE III MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 4. No Employer-Employee Relationship. This MOA does not create an employer-employee relationship between and among LGU-CDO, CU, and DepEd CDO, its officials and instructors, the NSP trainers, student-trainees, and, the other qualified applicants of the program.

Section 5. **Right to Revoke, Revise, Amend, or Rescind.** Either party may revoke, revise, amend, or rescind the MOA by notifying the other PARTY at least six (6) months prior to the graduation of the current batch. All parties shall ensure the orderly completion of ongoing programs.

Section 6. **Right to Renew**. This MOA is subject to review and renewal every three (3) years upon its effectivity

Section 7. **Confidentiality**. The Parties agree to keep all information and data exchanged or created under this MOA confidential and shall not be disclosed to anyone unless expressly given consent by the data subject. The Parties agree to strictly observe the Data Privacy Act and be bound by the Data Sharing Agreement, herein attached as Annex "A", and made an integral part of this MOA.

Section 8. **Dispute Resolution.** In case of dispute between the Parties arising out of or relating to this Agreement, the Parties agree to exert efforts to amicably settle the same. Failing at which, the dispute shall be brought for resolution by the proper courts of Cagayan de Oro City, to the exclusion of all other venues.

Section 9: Effectivity. This agreement shall take effect immediately upon signing by all parties concerned and shall remain in force unless sooner terminated by mutual consent of the parties, in writing.

DATA SHARING AGREEMENT

This Data Sharing Agreement (DSA) is entered into by and between the CITY GOVERNMENT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO (LGU-CDO), DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION-DIVISION OF CAGAYAN DE ORO, and CAPITOL UNIVERSITY (CU) to establish the content, use, and protection of data provided between the Parties in relation to the implementation of the Alternative Learning System-Night School Program (ALS-NSP).

I. Term

This Agreement shall be in effect for three (3) years in accordance with the term of the Memorandum of Agreement to which this Data Sharing Agreement is made an integral part.

II. Intended Use of Data

The following are the intended uses of the shared data:

- a. Student Identification, control, verification and screening
- b. Grouping or classification
- c. Statistical processing
- d. Conducting research for improvement of students' learning

III. Limitations on the use of data

Data disclosed by the scholars/students to or collected on behalf of either Party is the property of the Collecting Party, and shall only be used for the above-stated purposes and shall not be shared with third parties without the written permission/consent of the First/Second Party, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro and data subject/s.

Such data shall not be sold or used, internally or externally, and for any other purpose not directly related to services provided by the Parties in this Agreement without the written permission of the First/Second Party, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro and data subject/s.

IV. Data Security

Both parties shall exercise at least the same degree of care it uses with its own personal data and confidential information, but in no event less than reasonable care, to protect the personal data from misuse and unauthorized access or disclosure. It shall adapt reasonable administrative, physical, and technical measures to prevent loss, misuse and alteration of the information under its control.

V. Data Elements

Personal information shared between the Parties shall be limited to the data elements specifically defined and authorized by each Party. If the other Party needs to collect additional data, its authorized personnel must submit a request in writing to the other Party. Under no circumstances shall any Party collect any information classified as Sensitive or Confidential without the express written approval of the First/Second Party, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro and the data subject/s.

The data to be shared or collected shall be limited to the following elements:

a. Scholar's/Student's Name (First Name, Middle Name/Initial, Last Name)

- a. Birthdate
- b. Age

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- c. Gender
- d. Address
- e. COMELEC Registration
- f. Indigency Classification
- g. Contact Number and/or email address

Each party shall be responsible for securing consent from the patients to collect personal information and share these with the Other Party for referral purposes.

VI. Data Privacy Training

When there is an opportunity for the same, both Parties shall avail of any training for its personnel on internal security policies and procedures and on the Data Privacy Act, its Implementing Rules and Regulations, and National Privacy Commission Issuances to protect personal data.

VII. Breach Management

a. *Report.* Within twenty-four (24) hours of becoming aware of the unauthorized use or disclosure of the personal data or any security incident or possible security breach, the concerned Party shall promptly report the fact to the other party who shared the personal data. Both parties, shall, within seventy-two (72) hours from such occurrence, notify the National Privacy Commission and the concerned data subject in accordance with NPC Circular 16-03.

b. Cooperation and Mitigation. Both parties shall cooperate with any mediation that is necessary to:

- 1. Address any applicable reporting requirements, and
- 2. Mitigate any effects of such unauthorized use or disclosure of personal data or any security incident or possible security breach.

VIII. Amendments and Alterations to this Agreement

Parties may amend this Agreement by mutual consent, in writing, at any time.

IX. Termination of Services

In the event that the MOA is terminated, the other Party shall return to the Collecting Party, all data collected in the course of the MOA.

MARK C. MACAVENTA, through the College of Education ______, herein referred to as "PHINMA-COC".;

and

DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION-DIVISION OF CAGAYAN DE ORO is the agency that supervises all elementary and secondary institutions of the Department of Education (DepEd) in Cagayan de Oro represented herein by its Schools Division Superintendent, **ROY ANGELO E GAZO, Ph.D., CESO V**, hereinafter referred to as "DepED-CDO".

Witnesseth:

WHEREAS, CDO-LGU, under the present administration, considers Education as an empowering tool in the collective efforts for human development and a crucial component under its RISE Agenda;

WHEREAS, LGU-CDO, PHINMA-COC, and DepED-CDO are concerned about providing quality education as a right of every Filipino child;

WHEREAS, LGU-CDO, PHINMA-COC, and DepED-CDO believe in increasing the number of out-of-school youth, and adults who can complete formal basic education;

WHEREAS, LGU-CDO, PHINMA-COC, and DepED-CDO consider that the out-of-school youth and adults at risk are vulnerable groups that need to achieve literacy, numeracy, and values formation which will enable them to contribute to sustainable development:

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the preceding premises, the herein PARTIES hereunto agreed to the following:

ARTICLE I PURPOSE

The purpose of this agreement is to establish a partnership to implement the Alternative Learning System-Night School Program (ALS-NSP), providing out-of-school youth and adults at risk in Cagayan de Oro with opportunities for formal basic education, literacy, numeracy, and values formation. The ALS-NSP aims to empower these individuals, reintegrate them into the education system, or prepare them for the Accreditation and Equivalency (A&E) examination, supporting sustainable development. This collaboration aligns with the RISE Agenda of LGU-CDO, emphasizing education as a key tool for human development, and defines the roles and responsibilities of each party for effective program delivery and support.

ARTICLE II ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Section 1. LGU-CDO shall:

• 1

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 - ii. Coordination with relevant stakeholders for access to flexible learning options and delivery of educational programs that provide basic literacy and numeracy skills, vocational training, and life skills to the targeted clientele;
 - Partnerships and/or engagement with other stakeholders who may be able to offer apprenticeships and internships that provide hands-on experience;
 - iv. Access to mentors and counselors who can offer guidance, support and motivation;
 - Advocate for policies that support inclusive education, vocational training, and employment opportunities for out-of-school youth and adults at risk;
 - vi. Foster partnerships between government agencies, non-profits, educational institutions, and the private sector to create a comprehensive support network;
 - vii. Provision of tertiary and vocational education scholarships to qualified NSP beneficiaries/completers;
 - viii. Provision of certification of list of beneficiaries;
 - ix. Provision of Five Thousand (PhP5,000.00) worth of Financial Assistance per learner categorized as *Children in Conflict with the Law* (CICL) endorsed by the Office of the City Social Welfare and Development Officer, which will be channeled to the partner learning institution. The coverage of the operational support shall be for learning materials and modules, load allowance, transportation allowance, meal allowance, supplemental food packs, uniform, and ALS-NSP ID among other miscellaneous costs;

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- xi. Convene the quarterly partnership meeting and serve as Secretariat for the program's monitoring, assessment, evaluation and feedback mechanisms;
- xii. Provide documentation reports or best practices for the program's successful implementation.
- Cause the Office of the City Social Welfare and Development Officer to designate one (1) CSWD personnel to ensure social welfare responsiveness to the program's clientele, to wit:
 - i. Assess and certify individuals needing help and manage cases of the program's beneficiaries/clientele/learners;
 - Endorse clients to partner schools, concerned LGU department/offices, and and stakeholders who may be able to assist them finish at least basic education, gain employable skills, and land a job;
 - iii. Provide psycho-social consultation services to the learners;
 - iv. Organize outreach activities to identify children, youth, and adults at risk and connect them with available resources;
 - Mobilize critical quick response mechanism on man-made or natural disaster in humanitarian/emergency settings (flood, fire, earthquake, epidemic/pandemic crises) and provide legal assistance directly to highly vulnerable learners;
 - vi. Provide the required family interventions for parent-learners.
- c. Cause the Office of the Oro Youth Development Officer to carry out the following:
 - i. Arrange for safe spaces where youths at risk can gather for learning, socialization, and support;
 - ii. Proactively map and engage the out-of-school and maintain a database of their profile and needs;
 - iii. Assist the Oro Youth Center in its duty as a drop-in and referral center for the youth with problems such as teenage pregnancy, teenage prostitution, sexually transmitted disease/infection, boyfriend-girtfriend relationship concerns, parent-child relationship concerns, substance abuse, vagrancy and other anti-social behavior such truancy and vandalism, and other adolescent-related problems;

- iv. Include ALS-NSP beneficiaries in their programs and activities that promote a broad understanding of the problems affecting the youth in highly urbanized areas;
- v. Assign a focal person for the ALS-NSP.

Section 2. PHINMA-COC shall:

- Designate a program officer or focal person for the ALS-NSP;
- b. Partner with DepED-CDO-ALS in the orientation and capacity development for ALS volunteer/pre-service teachers;
- c. Promote the enrolment of preferred target beneficiaries within the adapted communities and submit the certificate of admission after three months of the commencement of classes to LGU-CDO through the Office of the City Education and Development Officer-City Scholarships Office;
- d. Mobilize student tutors or pre-service teachers who will handle supplemental activities and assist in values formation sessions;
- e. Co-facilitate the necessary orientation, capacity development, and guidelines for the ALS-NSP volunteers/pre-service teachers and student tutors;
- f. Provide classrooms for the use of the learning sessions;
- g. Permit ALS-NSP to use college/university facilities such as audio-visual rooms, theaters, ICT laboratories, and other learning facilities that will improve learners' learning;
- Monitor the conduct of the ALS-NSP classes;
- Ensure the safe environment of the ALS-NSP learners;
- J. Secure the permit from the PHINMA-COC Security Office for the entrance, stay, and exit procedures of the ALS-NSP learners;
- Provide uniform and identification cards for the bonafide learners;
- Reproduce ALS-NSP learning modules and materials for the learners;
- m. Consult with the ALS-NSP teacher on the progress and performance of the learners;
- n. Assist completers with the needed documents for the A&E exam;
- Hold the graduation rites of the A&E passers;
- Assist A&E passers with educational and/or technical vocational opportunities and the DepEd voucher program;
- Provide a financial report on all funds raised for the program, in cash or in-kind;
- Conduct annual evaluation of the program with partners and stakeholders; and

s. Submit the year-end report to be submitted to the DepEd CDO and LGU-CDO.

Section 3. DepEd CDO shall:

- a. Recognize PHINMA-COC as a satellite center/provider for ALS;
- b. Assign mobile ALS teacher/s;
- Facilitate the enrolment in the Learner Information System (LIS) of the learners and provide the certificate of enrollment to LGU-CDO through the Office of the City Education and Development Officer-City Scholarships Office;
- d. Provide the ALS mobile teacher with assistance in conducting the learning sessions;
- e. Facilitate the necessary orientation, capacity development, and guidelines for the ALS-NSP Teacher and ALS-NSP volunteer/pre-service teachers;
- f. Provide ALS learning resources and modules;
- g. Allow access to ALS documents such as curriculum guide, learning activity sheets (LAS), tools, and templates for references;
- h. Provide input on the direction, curriculum, and A&E examination schedule;
- i. Monitor the conduct of the ALS-NSP classes;
- j. Advise the schedule of the Presentation Portfolio Assessment (PPA) for the ALS-NSP learners; and
- k. Participate in the evaluation of the program.

ARTICLE III MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 4. No Employer-Employee Relationship. This MOA does not create an employer-employee relationship between and among LGU-CDO, PHINMA-COC, and DepEd CDO, its officials and instructors, the NSP trainers, student-trainees, and, the other qualified applicants of the program.

Section 5. **Right to Revoke, Revise, Amend, or Rescind**. Either party may revoke, revise, amend, or rescind the MOA by notifying the other PARTY at least six (6) months prior to the graduation of the current batch. All parties shall ensure the orderly completion of ongoing programs.

Section 6. **Right to Renew.** This MOA is subject to review and renewal every three (3) years upon its effectivity

Section 7. **Confidentiality.** The Parties agree to keep all information and data exchanged or created under this MOA confidential and shall not be disclosed to anyone unless expressly given consent by the data subject. The Parties agree to strictly observe the Data Privacy Act and be bound by the Data Sharing Agreement, herein attached as Annex "A", and made an integral part of this MOA.

Section 8. **Dispute Resolution.** In case of dispute between the Parties arising out of or relating to this Agreement, the Parties agree to exert efforts to amicably settle the same. Failing at which, the dispute shall be brought for resolution by the proper courts of Cagayan de Oro City, to the exclusion of all other venues.

Section 9: Effectivity. This agreement shall take effect immediately upon signing by all parties concerned and shall remain in force unless sooner terminated by mutual consent of the parties, in writing.

Annex A —

DATA SHARING AGREEMENT

This Data Sharing Agreement (DSA) is entered into by and between the CITY GOVERNMENT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO (LGU-CDO) and PHINMA CAGAYAN DE ORO COLLEGE (PHINMA-COC) to establish the content, use, and protection of data provided between the Parties in relation to the implementation of the Alternative Learning System-Night School Program (ALS-NSP).

I. Term

This Agreement shall be in effect for three (3) years in accordance with the term of the Memorandum of Agreement to which this Data Sharing Agreement is made an integral part.

II. Intended Use of Data

The following are the intended uses of the shared data:

- a. Student Identification, control, verification and screening
- b. Grouping or classification
- c. Statistical processing
- d. Conducting research for improvement of students' learning

III. Limitations on the use of data

Data disclosed by the scholars/students to or collected on behalf of either Party is the property of the Collecting Party, and shall only be used for the above-stated purposes and shall not be shared with third parties without the written permission/consent of the First/Second Party, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro and data subject/s.

Such data shall not be sold or used, internally or externally, and for any other purpose not directly related to services provided by the Parties in this Agreement without the written permission of the First/Second Party, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro and data subject/s.

IV. Data Security

Both parties shall exercise at least the same degree of care it uses with its own personal data and confidential information, but in no event less than reasonable care, to protect the personal data from misuse and unauthorized access or disclosure. It shall adapt reasonable administrative, physical, and technical measures to prevent loss, misuse and alteration of the information under its control.

V. Data Elements

Personal information shared between the Parties shall be limited to the data elements specifically defined and authorized by each Party. If the other Party needs to collect additional data, its authorized personnel must submit a request in writing to the other Party. Under no circumstances shall any Party collect any information classified as Sensitive or Confidential without the express written approval of the First/Second Party, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro and the data subject/s.

The data to be shared or collected shall be limited to the following elements:

- a. Scholar's/Student's Name (First Name, Middle Name/Initial, Last Name)
- b. Birthdate

- c. Age
- d. Gender
- e. Address
- f. COMELEC Registration
- g. Indigency Classification
- h. Contact Number and/or email address

Each party shall be responsible for securing consent from the patients to collect personal information and share these with the Other Party for referral purposes.

VI. Data Privacy Training

When there is an opportunity for the same, both Parties shall avail of any training for its personnel on internal security policies and procedures and on the Data Privacy Act, its Implementing Rules and Regulations, and National Privacy Commission Issuances to protect personal data.

VII. Breach Management

a. *Report.* Within twenty-four (24) hours of becoming aware of the unauthorized use or disclosure of the personal data or any security incident or possible security breach, the concerned Party shall promptly report the fact to the other party who shared the personal data. Both parties, shall, within seventy-two (72) hours from such occurrence, notify the National Privacy Commission and the concerned data subject in accordance with NPC Circular 16-03.

b. Cooperation and Mitigation. Both parties shall cooperate with any mediation that is necessary to:

- 1. Address any applicable reporting requirements, and
- 2. Mitigate any effects of such unauthorized use or disclosure of personal data or any security incident or possible security breach.

VIII. Amendments and Alterations to this Agreement

Parties may amend this Agreement by mutual consent, in writing, at any time.

IX. Termination of Services

In the event that the MOA is terminated, the other Party shall return to the Collecting Party, all data collected in the course of the MOA.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Undertaking is entered into and executed by and between:

The Department of Public Works and Highways – Cagayan de Oro City 2nd District Engineering Office (DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO, the state's engineering and construction arm to provide infrastructure facilities for national development within region 10, headed by its Office-In-Charge (OIC) District Engineer, JAN PAULO C. LISONDRA, with principal address at Macabalan, Cagayan de Oro City, hereinafter referred to as the (DPWH-CDOC 2ND DEO)

-and-

The Local Government Unit of Cagayan de Oro City (LGU-CDOC), headed by its City Mayor, HON. ROLANDO A. UY, with principal address at Cagayan de Oro City herein referred to as LGU-CDOC.

-WITNESSETH-

WHEREAS, the DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO and the LGU-CDOC are involved and committed to the successful implementation of CY 2024 Farm to Market Roads (FMR) to provide infrastructure facilities for national development;

WHEREAS, the Office of the Secretary Department of Public Works and Highways, Office of the Secretary issued Sub-Allotment Advice (SAA) <u>SR2024-02-011155</u>, (SAA) <u>SR2024-02-011163</u> and (SAA) <u>SR2024-02-011171</u> dated <u>February 16, 2024</u> to Cagayan de Oro City 2nd District Engineering Office (CDOC 2nd DEO), for various infrastructure projects and allocated the amount of **Sixty Six Million Pesos (Php 66,000,000.00)** for the following CY 2024 FMR projects:

WHEREAS, the FMR projects shall be implemented under counter-parting scheme, which the LGU-CDOC, shall provide a counterpart fund of not less than 10% of the project cost, as provided for in Section 52 of Republic Act 8435 (RA 8435), also known as "Agriculture and Fisheries Modernization Act (AFMA);

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the forgoing premises, the PARTIES to this Memorandum of Undertaking (MOU) do hereby agree to undertake the following terms and conditions;

Section 1. COVERAGE

Section 1.1 This MOU covers the implementation of the various CY 2024 FMR projects identified by the Hon. Rufus B. Rodriguez, 2nd Congressional District Representative, Cagayan de Oro City, validated and prioritized by DA for implementation by the DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO, and;

Section 1.2. Policy Guidelines. All proposed CY 2024 FMR projects must meet the criteria stated in the Implementing Guidelines on the Implementation of Farm-to-Market Road Development Program of the Department of Agriculture.

Section 2. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS, CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY – 2ND DISTRICT ENGINEERING OFFICE (DPWH-CDOC 2ND DEO)

Section 2.1 The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall cause the preparation of Program of Works (POWs) and Detailed Engineering Design (DED), noted by the LGU-CDOC City Agriculture Office (CAO);

Section 2.2 The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall include in the preparation of POWs the 10% counterpart fund thru LGU-CDOC amounting to **Six Million Pesos (Php 6,000,000.00)** for the implementation of the named CY 2024 FMR projects. The counterpart fund shall be in the form of cash. The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall provide breakdown of cash in accordance with the Sub-project Program of Works and Financing Mix presented (Annex F);

Section 2.3 The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall issue official receipt to the LGU-CDOC upon receipt of the 10% counterpart for the implementation of the CY 2024 FMR projects;

Section 2.4 The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall secure Environmental Compliance Certificate (ECC) or Certificate of Non-Coverage (CNC) if applicable and adhere to its provisions and the other social safeguard measures;

Section 2.5 The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall undertake the bidding and award of contract for the project's civil works in accordance with Republic Act 9184 (RA 9184), also known as "Government Procurement Reform Act". The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO may pursue the procurement process upon the approval of the POWs & DEDs and Certificate of Availability of Funds (CAFs) and shall award the Contract only upon receipt of 10% counterpart from the LGU-CDOC;

Section 2.6 The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall conduct procurement of the total project fund (DA Project Fund + LGU-CDOC counterpart fund) per approved POWs/DEDs;

Section 2.7 The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall be responsible for the 100% completion of the projects in case the concerned contractor/s defaults in the implementation of the mentioned projects;

Section 2.8 The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall complete the CY 2024 FMR projects within the calendar days as indicated in the PERT/CPMs;

Section 2.9 The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall be fully responsible for the accounting and disbursement of funds in accordance with existing Commission of Audit (COA), Department of Budget and Management (DBM) and other existing government procedures, rules and regulations;

Section 2.10 The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall designate a Project Engineer in every CY 2024 FMR project identified who shall supervise all the project activities the entire duration of the projects; and

Section 2.11 The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall facilitate the turnover of completed CY 2024 FMR projects to the concerned local government unit beneficiaries in accordance with the provisions of the MOU.

Section 3. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CITY LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY (LGU-CDOC)

Section 3.1 The LGU-CDOC shall issue CAFs to the DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO for the necessary counterpart fund amounting to Six Million Pesos (Ph 6,000,000.00) signed by the City Local Finance Committee;

Section 3.2 The LGU-CDOCC counterpart fund amounting to Six Million Pesos (Ph 6,000,000.00) shall be downloaded by the LGU-CDOC to DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO, upon approval of the MOU;

Section 3.3 The LGU-CDOC shall monitor the project implementation of the mentioned CY 2024 FMR projects as identified under this MOU; and

Section 3.4 The LGU-CDOC shall maintain the good condition of the enumerated CY 2024 FMR projects after completion and turn-over from the DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO.

Section 4. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 4.1 The DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO shall transfer the assets at cost to the LGU-CDOC after final acceptance of the projects and all required liquidation reports shall be submitted accordingly, and such shall be taken up in the books of the LGU-CDOC;

Section 4.2 In the event of any breach of agreement/s stated herein, the DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO has the option to terminate this Agreement ten (10) days after receipt of written Notice. Termination shall include the availment of other right and remedies stipulated in this MOU;

Section 4.3 Implementation of Standards and Procedures. The involved parties, i.e. DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO, LGU-CDOC, shall guarantee to carry out the CY 2024 FMR projects using generally accepted Professional and Technical Standards of the DPWH and in accordance with the attached schedules and appropriate Procurement Procedures as stipulated in the R.A. 9184, also known as "Government Procurement Reform Act";

Section 4.4 Authorized Representative/s. Any action required or permitted to be taken and any document/s required or permitted to be executed under this MOU in behalf of both parties (DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO and LGU-CDOC) may be taken or executed by the DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO and LGU-CDOC or any other person as may be designated in writing, provided, such assignment or designation is being authorized by DPWH-CDOC 2nd DEO and/or LGU-CDOC;.

Section 4.5 Any dispute/disagreement arising due to the implementation of this MOU shall be settled and filed in the Regular Courts of Cagayan de Oro City;

Section 4.6 This MOU shall take effect upon the signing of the signatories herein identified and shall be terminated upon final acceptance of the project/s.


