MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT, entered into by and between:

DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION – DIVISION OF CAGAYAN DE ORO, an agency of the National Government of the Philippine Government Educational Institution, mandated to oversee the national objectives for public education within the geographical location of Cagayan de Oro, with office address at Upper Balulang, Cagayan de Oro City, and herein represented by its School Division Superintendent, **DR. ROY ANGELO E. GAZO, CESO V**, and hereinafter referred to as the **“1ST PARTY”**;

The **CITY GOVERNMENT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO (LGU-CDO)**, a local government unit organized and created under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with principal office address located at 89 Hayes St., Cagayan de Oro City, duly represented by **HON. ROLANDO A. UY**, in his capacity as the City Mayor, hereafter referred to as **“2ND PARTY”**;

- and -

1ST VALLEY CREDIT COOPERATIVE, a primary cooperative duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Philippines with its principal place of business at Carmen, Cagayan de Oro City, Philippines, represented herein by its Chairperson, **PETER ALFON**.

CITY HALL EMPLOYEES MULTIPURPOSE COOPERATIVE, a primary cooperative duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Philippines with its principal place of business at City Hall, Cagayan de Oro City, Philippines, represented herein by its Chairman, **ELDIE S. DAAYATA**.

COA PRIME INVESTORS MULTI-PURPOSE COOPERATIVE, a primary cooperative duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Philippines with its principal place of business at COA R10 Bldg. J.V. Serina St., Carmen, Cagayan de Oro City, Philippines, represented herein by its Chairperson, **MARILOU C. MAMPAO**.

KING MULTI-PURPOSE COOPERATIVE, a primary cooperative duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Philippines with its principal place of business at Carmen, Cagayan de Oro City, Philippines, represented herein by its Chief Executive Officer, **NESTOR D. ORTIGOZA**.

ORO SAVINGS AND SHARING MULTI-PURPOSE COOPERATIVE, a primary cooperative duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Philippines with its principal place of business at Capistrano St., Cagayan de Oro City, Philippines, represented herein by its Chairperson, **ATTY. ISIDRO LICO**.

XAVIER UNIVERSITY COMMUNITY CREDIT COOPERATIVE, a primary cooperative duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Philippines with its principal place of business at Corrales Avenue, Cagayan de Oro City, Philippines, represented herein by its Chairman, **MILBERT P. DIALOGO**.

For the purpose of this Agreement, the afore-named schools shall collectively be referred to as **"3RD PARTY"**;

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the PARTIES have recognized the need for the establishment of a "School-Based Teen Center" which is serving youth and adolescents and is established primarily to provide appropriate sexuality and reproductive health information, skills, and services to the youth and adolescents;

WHEREAS, 3RD PARTY, in coordination with 2ND PARTY and 1ST PARTY, supports the establishment of a Teen Center in targeted areas in Cagayan de Oro City and advocates to prevent teenage pregnancy, promote adolescent and youth reproductive health, instill financial literacy, and boost mental health in adolescents, among others;

WHEREAS, 3RD PARTY, 2ND PARTY, and 1ST PARTY, altogether determined that there shall be a Teen Center, and agreed to give full support to the NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOLS in establishing a Teen Center;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and consideration of the foregoing premises and mutual covenants, the PARTIES hereby agree as follows:

- PURPOSE.** The purpose of this Agreement is the creation of a "Teen Center" through the joint efforts of the PARTIES, in the selected National High Schools of Cagayan de Oro City and its corresponding cooperative to adopt, particularly:

2. **GOAL.** The goal of this Agreement is the promotion of the immediate well-being and the longer-term positive development of the youth and adolescents.
3. **SHARED RESPONSIBILITY.** For the successful implementation of this Agreement, all the PARTIES herein agree: ★
- a. To give full support to the Teen Centers and sponsor their activities and programs that endeavor for the betterment of the youth and adolescents;
 - b. To supervise, guide, and participate in all of the affairs of the Teen Centers;
 - c. To ensure that the plans and programs of the Teen Centers are in keeping with the objectives of this Agreement, and ensure that the plans and programs are effective tools to resolve the issues of the youth and adolescents and improve their overall well-being;
 - d. To ensure the sustainability of the program implementation regardless of the appointed School Division Superintendent of the Department of Education under the supervision of the schools.
 - e. To coordinate and collaborate and find ways to continually improve the Teen Centers and the programs and activities they offer to adolescents and pursue measures that would lessen the societal peer pressure and stand firm in their viewpoint in facing various challenges.

4. **OBLIGATION OF THE PARTIES.**

A. COOPERATIVES

- i. Shall provide necessary materials, equipment, and capacity-building (iii) to the adopted NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOLS;

 - a. Financial Literacy Training
 - b. Enterprise Development Training
 - c. Leadership Training, among others;
- iv. Shall be open in assisting NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOLS beyond the

abovementioned items (i).

★ **B. LGU-CDO - COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DIVISION**

Community Improvement Department

- i. Shall provide training/seminar/orientation to the Teen Center Operators and Peer Educators of the identified NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOLS;
- ii. Shall assist COOPERATIVES, and their employees/staff, during their semi-annual visit to the Teen Centers established in the NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOLS;
- iii. Shall submit a quarterly consolidated report to COOPERATIVES on the activities, programs, and affairs conducted by the NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOLS in the Teen Centers;
- iv. Shall monitor and evaluate the Teen Centers in the NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOLS and provide feedback and recommendation/s to COOPERATIVES for the improvement and betterment of the Teen Centers.

Will there be employer-employee relationship created?

C. DEPED DIVISION

- i. Shall Ensure attendance of the Teen Center Managers in the training/seminar/orientation conducted by COOPERATIVES and CID;
- ii. Shall allow the 3RD PARTY to hold an activity related to the above-mentioned programs as indicated in paragraph.;
- iii. Shall Formulate ACTION PLAN for the succeeding academic year and submit the same to the CID not later than September of every year;
- iv. Shall Submit semi-annual reports on activities, programs, and other affairs conducted by the Teen Centers, specifying therein the number of students, or adolescents who attended and availed of the Teen Center services, their sex, age, and other related personal circumstances;
- v. Shall Make quarterly inventory of the materials and equipment provided by COOPERATIVES;
- vi. Shall Research the impact of an Operational School-Based Teen Center in addressing social issues on school drop-outs, teenage pregnancy, mental health issues, and other related issues.

5. **TERM.** This Agreement shall be effective upon the signing hereof by all parties and shall continue in full force and effect unless sooner terminated by either or all of the parties herein upon prior written notice given to the other parties.

6. **WARRANTY.** All the parties herein warrant that they are duly authorized to enter into this Agreement.

7. **COMPLETE AGREEMENT.** This agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties, modifications and alterations to the provision found herein may only be made upon written agreement of the parties.

8. **BINDING EFFECT.** This Agreement shall be binding not only on the PARTIES herein but also on their heirs, assigns, and successors-in-interest, as the case may be.

9. **NON-ASSIGNMENT.** This Agreement may not be transferred or assigned by either Party without the prior written consent of the other.

10. **SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.** Should one or more of the provisions of this Agreement be declared null and void, inefficacious or ineffectual for any reason whatsoever, the other provisions shall remain in full force and effect notwithstanding such defect or

flaw, provided the rights of the parties are not adversely affected thereby.

11. **DISPUTE RESOLUTION AND VENUE.** The Parties shall as often as possible mutually consult with each other with respect to the performance of their respective obligations under this Agreement. The Parties shall exert their best efforts to properly resolve any differences or disagreements with respect to any dispute that may arise in connection with this Agreement. Should the parties fail to settle their dispute, the parties hereby agree that the Courts of Cagayan de Oro City shall be the exclusive venue of any or all actions or suits between the parties, to the exclusion of all other courts and venues.

8 *Whereas*, Section 6-A of Ordinance No. 13178-2016, entitled: “An ordinance consolidating and
9 further amending Ordinance No. 9888-2005 and Ordinance No. 10046-2006, otherwise known as the
10 Comprehensive Socialized Housing Program for the Underprivileged and Homeless Citizens of Cagayan de Oro
11 City, formerly Piso-Piso Program, so as to provide herein additional guidelines and to provide penalty for the
12 violation thereof and for other purposes”, as amended by Ordinance No. 13753-2019, states that:

13 “SECTION 6-A. – For On-Site Development where an intent to sell has
14 been issued by the lot owner and an agreement has been reached as to its
15 reasonable market price, the City Government shall only provide Twenty Percent
16 (20%) of the total agreed acquisition cost, representing equity, at no obligation on
17 the part of the association-beneficiaries.”

18 *Whereas*, the City Housing and Urban Development Department (CHUDD) recommended
19 the adoption of general guidelines on how urban poor homeowners associations can qualify and
20 avail of such assistance to comply with accounting and auditing rules and regulations and
21 streamline the process and efficiently spend the financial resources of the City;

22 **NOW, THEREFORE:**

23 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the 20th City Council (*Sangguniang Panlungsod*) in session that:

24 **SECTION 1.** The following guidelines shall be strictly followed and complied in the grant of
25 financial assistance in the form of 20% Equity for the cost of on-site land acquisition by urban poor
26 associations or qualified beneficiaries of on-site socialized housing program of the City pursuant to
27 Ordinance No. 13178-2016, entitled: “An ordinance consolidating and further amending Ordinance No.
28 9888-2005 and Ordinance No. 10046-2006, otherwise known as the Comprehensive Socialized Housing Program
29 for the Underprivileged and Homeless Citizens of Cagayan de Oro City, formerly Piso-Piso Program, so as to provide
30 herein additional guidelines and to provide penalty for the violation thereof and for other purposes”, as amended
31 by Ordinance No. 13753-2019, viz:

32 **A) QUALIFICATIONS**

- 33 1) Homeowners Association (HOA) accredited by the DHSUD and the Sangguniang
34 Panlungsod;
35 2) Urban Poor Association under the Presidential Commission of the Urban Poor;

37 *HOA and Urban Poor Association shall be subject to qualifications set by Ordinance No.
38 13178-2016, *aka* Comprehensive Socialized Housing Program of 2016.

40 **B) GENERAL GUIDELINES**

- 41
42 1) Applicant HOA or Urban Poor Association can avail of a maximum of 20% of the cost of the
43 land to be acquired for on-site development.
44 2) Application shall be done by the association.
45 3) The BIR Zonal Value shall serve as the benchmark assessment for the price of the property.
46 4) Existing lot of each HOA member shall not exceed 150 square meters.
47 5) The financial assistance shall be paid directly to the property seller/vendor.

48 **C) PROCEDURE**

- 49 1) Applicants shall submit a proposal of intent applying for the financial assistance together
50 with the PCUP or SEC Certificate (if not yet certified under DHSUD), locational map of the

- 51 property, and tax declaration. The letter should be addressed to the Department Head of
 52 CHUDD.
- 53 2) CHUDD shall only review applications with complete minimum requirements and applicants
 54 shall be notified should there are any deficiencies, or the application is approved
 55 preliminarily.
- 56 3) Applicants shall submit the following documents:
- 57 i) DHSUD Certification,
 - 58 ii) City Council Resolution of accreditation,
 - 59 iii) Masterlist of HOA members,
 - 60 iv) Notarized intent to sell by the property owner concerned,
 - 61 v) Zoning Certificate,
 - 62 vi) Updated true copy of titles and/or back titles,
 - 63 vii) Bank statement,
 - 64 viii) Proposed subdivision plan,
 - 65 ix) HOA Board Resolution stating that the HOA members are willing to acquire the
 66 property.
- 67 4) CHUDD shall review the BIR zoning value of the property and conduct socio-economic
 68 profiling of the HOA members. CHUDD shall also convene the City Engineering Office,
 69 Office of the Building Official, City Local Environment and Natural Resources Office, and
 70 City Assessors Office to conduct site inspection. Moreover, CHUDD shall finalize and
 71 prepare the evaluation report.
- 72 5) Upon the completion of the evaluation report, CHUDD shall forward the application to the
 73 City Council through the Subdivision and Landed Estate Committee for an enactment of an
 74 Ordinance declaring the lot/s occupied as On-Site Resettlement Area.
- 75 6) Upon the enactment of an Ordinance declaring the lots occupied as On-Site Resettlement,
 76 CHUDD shall endorse the application to the Local Finance Committee for financial
 77 assessment, issuing as a result a certification guaranteeing the viability of such assistance
 78 considering the fiscal capacity of the City. Qualified applicants may be advised to be
 79 provided assistance on the succeeding fiscal year.
- 80 7) Upon the issuance by the Local Finance Committee of a Certificate of Availability of Funds
 81 (CAF), CHUDD shall forward the application to the City Legal Office for the preparation of a
 82 Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) stipulating therein the mode of release, obligations of
 83 parties and penalties of applicants for violation of the agreement. CHUDD shall not proceed
 84 with the application if there is no proof of initial payment or Letter of Guarantee.
- 85 8) The City Legal Office shall then forward the application to the City Mayor affixing the
 86 following: (1) MOA, and (2) Endorsement letter to the Sangguniang Panlungsod for passage
 87 of an Ordinance Granting the association the City's 20% Equity on the cost of land
 88 acquisition and granting authority to the City Mayor to sign the MOA with the association.
- 89 9) The MOA signing shall not proceed without Deed of Assignment, and if an approved
 90 PSDP/DP/PALC is needed for the application.
- 91 10) A formal turnover of the check payable to the bank/seller/vendor shall be conducted for the
 92 purpose.

93 D) Documentary Requirements

94 On the part of the HOA:

- 95 1) Proposal letter/Letter of Intent
- 96 2) PCUP or SEC certificate (PCUP certificate along with updated general information sheet,

123 **SECTION 2.** There shall be allocated in the annual budget or supplemental budget of the

125 No. 13178-2016, as amended, covering the grant of 20% equity financial assistance.

126 For this purpose, the CHUDD shall prepare the budget proposal for the year of
127 implementation thereof as well as the Project Brief for the plan-budget year and ensuing years for

129 **SECTION 3.** The pertinent provisions of Ordinance No. 13178-2016 and other applicable

In line with the *Pambansang Pabahay Para sa Pilipino Program (4PH)* of President Ferdinand Marcos Jr., And the RISE Agenda of Mayor Rolando "Klarex Uy, the Department is exhausting all means to provide affordable and decent shelter to underprivileged households in the city.

One way to address the city's housing backlog is through the implementation of City Ordinance No. 13753-2019, which mandates the City Government to provide 20% financial assistance of the total agreed-upon land acquisition cost to urban poor homeowners associations. However, the ordinance does not stipulate any general guidelines on how urban poor homeowners associations can qualify for and avail of the assistance. Additionally, having no financial obligation on the part of beneficiaries is not sustainable and may have legal complications with the accounting and auditing regulations of the Commission on Audit (COA). Given these concerns, the Department is respectfully proposing the following amendments to the ordinance, to wit:

- A.) Add provisions therein stipulating the general guidelines which includes the qualifications and process on how to access the assistance (see attached file);
- B.) Add a provision wherein the City Council shall set the financial obligations on the part of the beneficiaries.

It is deemed that incorporating the aforementioned regulations will streamline the process and allocate resources more efficiently.

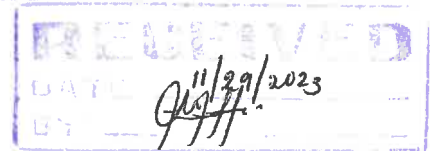

BE IT ORDAINED by the 19th Sangguniang Panlungsod (City Council) of Cagayan de Oro that:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 13178-2016, entitled: "*An ordinance consolidating and further amending Ordinance No. 9888-2005 and Ordinance No. 10046-2006, otherwise known as the Comprehensive Socialized Housing Program for the underprivileged and homeless citizens of Cagayan de Oro City, formerly Piso-Piso Program, so as to provide therein additional guidelines and to provide penalty for violation thereof and for other purposes*", is hereby amended by adding Section 6-A therein, to read in full as follows:

'SECTION 6-A. – For On-Site Development where an intent to sell has been issued by the lot owner and an agreement has been reached as to its reasonable market price, the City Government shall only provide **Twenty Percent (20%)** of the total agreed acquisition cost, representing equity, at no obligation on the part of the association-beneficiaries.

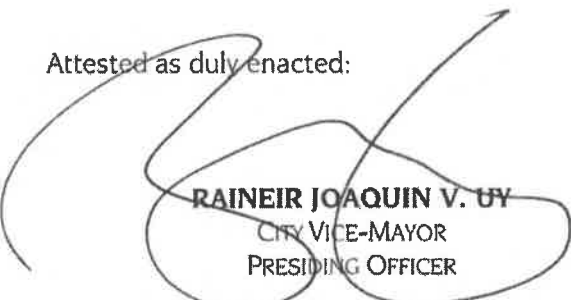

Additionally, having no financial obligation on the part of beneficiaries is not sustainable and may have legal complications with the accounting and auditing regulations of the Commission on Audit (COA). Given these concerns, the Department is hereby proposing the following amendments to the ordinance, to wit:

- A.) Add provisions therein stipulating the general guidelines which includes the qualifications and process on how to access the assistance (see attached file);
- B.) Add a provision wherein the City Council shall set the financial obligations on the part of the beneficiaries.

It is deemed that incorporating the aforementioned regulations will streamline the process and allocate resources more efficiently.

RE: Legal review of the proposed Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the City Government of Cagayan de Oro thru the City Veterinary Office (CVO) and the Agricultural Training Institute – Regional Training Center X for the allocation of the TEN MILLION PESOS to the LGU- CDOC in consonance with the project, “30 Sow – Level Swine Multiplier and Techno- Demo Farm” under the INSPIRE program of the National Livestock program (NLP).

This office has thoroughly reviewed the above-mentioned MOA and finds the contract to be **legally sound and favorable** to City Government of Cagayan de Oro City, through CVO, save to the following legal recommendations as follows;

First, a **Certificate of No Objection** must be obtained from the Local Finance Committee (LFC) in consideration with the responsibility to be undertaken by LGU-CDOC for the other expenses not covered by the ATI-RTC X funding under ITEM II, No. 5 of the aforesaid MOA.

Second, pertaining to the terms of the provisions on the Penalty Clause in relation to the non-compliance by the parties to the contract, this office **recommends** an **ARBITRATION CLAUSE** instead of the abovementioned clause in cases of settlement of neglect, failure or refusal and non-compliance with the conditions set forth in the MOA, as follows:

“Any dispute, controversy, difference or claim arising out of or in relation to this agreement, including any question as to the interpretation, implementation, existence, validity, breach or termination thereof or as to any non-contractual obligation arising out of or relating thereto, shall be referred to and finally resolved by arbitration in accordance with the Arbitration Rules in force at the time of the commencement of the arbitration, which rules are deemed incorporated by reference in this clause.”

The aforesaid recommendation is in view of the public and basic services rendered by the parties involved in the MOA, which are both government agencies.



All the other provisions, the City Government find the terms and conditions of the MOA for the best interests of the City Government, and can fully comply with it, thru the

City Veterinary Office. Thus, this office recommends that the Terms of the MOA be duly forwarded to the Honorable Members of the City Council for their favorable consideration, with a request for an Ordinance authorizing the City Mayor to enter into and sign the same, pursuant to Sec. 455 (1) (vi)¹ of the Local Government Code.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENT:

This Memorandum of Agreement is made, entered into and executed by and between:

The **AGRICULTURAL TRAINING INSTITUTE – REGIONAL TRAINING CENTER X**, a government agency created and existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with address at **El Salvador City, Misamis Oriental** represented by its Director IV, **REMELYN R. RECOTER, MNSA, CESO III**, herein referred to as the “**ATI-RTC X**”.

-and-

The **LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY**, a local government unit created and existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines with address at **Hayes St., Cagayan de Oro City** represented herein by its City Mayor, **ROLANDO “KLAREX” A. UY**, duly authorized by the Sangguniang Bayan to represent the LGU to enter into this agreement through a resolution, herein referred to as the “**LGU**”.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 8435 otherwise known as *Agriculture and Fisheries Modernization Act of 1997 (AFMA)* sets out the Government’s policies in the agriculture sector in attaining equitable distribution of opportunities, income, and wealth, expanding productivity and sustaining increase in production of goods and services thereby raising the quality of life of the people;

WHEREAS, ATI – RTC X with the assistance of the National Livestock Program (NLP), launched the **Integrated National Swine Production Initiatives for Recovery and Expansion (INSPIRE) Program** to implement calibrated repopulation and enhancement of the local swine industry to recover the sector’s capacity to locally produce sufficient supply of hogs and pork;

WHEREAS, the **30 Sow-Level Swine Multiplier and Techno-demo Farm Project** will complement the Component 2 of the INSPIRE Program, which is the establishment of Swine Multiplier and Techno-demo Farms that aims to build, restore and recover the breeder base to support the gradual restocking and repopulation of the swine industry;

WHEREAS, ATI-RTC X will identify potential partners, Local Government Units (LGUs), government-accredited Farmers’ Cooperative or Associations (FCAs) and State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) that has the capacity and willingness to implement the program, maintain the operations and produce the targeted result;

WHEREAS, the **LGU** was assessed and evaluated to be eligible and qualified to receive housing facilities, breeder animals, equipment and initial inputs for the establishment of a “**30 Sow-Level Swine Multiplier and Techno-demo Farm Project**” under the INSPIRE Program;

WHEREAS, ATI-RTC X and the **LGU** jointly pledge to extend full support and cooperation for the successful implementation of the project entitled “**30 Sow-Level Swine Multiplier and Techno-demo Farm**” under the **INSPIRE Program** of the NLP, herein referred to as the **PROJECT** in **CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY, MISAMIS ORIENTAL**;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the above-premises and their mutual covenant herein set forth, the parties hereby agree on the following:

A. COVERAGE OF THE MOA

1. This Memorandum of Agreement covers the Fund Transfer from ATI-RTC X to the LGU for the implementation of the **PROJECT** in **CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY, MISAMIS ORIENTAL**.

B. THE PROJECT

- I. The Project is entitled: **30 Sow-Level Swine Multiplier and Techno-demo Farm Project** and shall have the following objectives:

1. To contribute in the improvement of genetic make-up of productive females in **CAGAYAN DE ORO** thru the production and distribution of **699 heads (F1 female weaners)** quality and DNA-tested female breeders (LR x LW);
2. To contribute in the supply of safe and nutritious pork through the production and distribution of **465 heads male (castrates)**;
3. Provide a venue for trainings, extension, and learning of farmers, students, and interested individuals; and,
4. Support DA and other government agencies' swine-based livelihood programs by producing adequate and quality stocks to supply these program's needs.

- II. The Project shall cover the City of Cagayan de Oro and other nearby provinces in the region in as much as its two project components include extension support and training services and policy advocacy.

It shall benefit the government livestock technicians and extensionist; agricultural teachers of state colleges and universities; farmer leaders of agri-based people's organization; small and medium-scale pig farmers; animal feed/drug technical personnel; veterinarians; students of veterinary and agricultural schools, colleges and universities, and will indirectly benefit the feed millers, corn growers, meat processors middlemen, consumers, pig raisers and other stakeholders of the industry.

C. OBLIGATIONS AND PARTIES CONCERNED

- I. The **AGRICULTURAL TRAINING INSTITUTE-REGIONAL TRAINING CENTER X (ATI-RTC X)** shall:

1. Allocate the amount of **Ten Million Pesos (Php10,000,000.00)**, to be transferred to the **LGU** through funding check for the implementation of the **PROJECT** in the City of Cagayan de Oro (*see annex 1 for the breakdown*);
2. Conduct site validation of the proposed site;
3. Review and approve the project proposal and other related documents prior to the implementation;
4. Review and approve the final design, cost estimates, program of works, etc. submitted by the **LGU** prior to the conduct of bidding;

5. Provide capability building intervention for the continuing enhancement of the beneficiary;
6. Consolidate and submit quarterly monitoring report of the recipient;
7. Monitor and evaluate of the project until the project is fully repaid;
8. Demand from the **LGU** to submit liquidation report as prescribed by COA Circular No. 94-013 dated December 13,1994 within six (6) months after completion of the delivery and/or establishment of all the components of the **PROJECT** as specified in the project proposal and documents;
9. Demand from the **LGU** the return/refund of (a) that portion of the fund which remains unused within six (6) months after the completion of the delivery and/or establishment of all the components of the **PROJECT** as specified in the project proposal and documents, and (b) any disallowed amount after the financial audit pursuant to COA Circular No. 94-013 dated December 13,1994;
10. Demand from the **LGU** the return/refund to the Bureau of Treasury of the full amount released in any of the following cases:
 - (a) Misappropriation of funds without prejudice to the filing of administrative and/or criminal charges as circumstances may warrant;
 - (b) Non-compliance with any provision stated in this agreement; and,
 - (c) Commission of any act inconsistent with or contrary to the spirit and avowed intent of this agreement;
11. Issue a certification that the **LGU** has no pending unliquidated fund transfer;
12. Provide technical assistance in the procurement of animals, preparation of design and scope of works of the animal housing/facilities, specifications of equipment, and guidance on the project processing and implementation to ensure the sustainability of the project;
13. Assist the **LGU** in the Registration of all animals and offspring in the Philippine Animal Health Information System (PhilAHIS) during the operationalization of the project;
14. Document and package the best practices/technologies of the project; and
15. Promote the project through social media or any platform.

II. The LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT shall:

1. Provide counterpart for the establishment and maintenance of the Project such as land, manpower, utilities, consumables and veterinary drugs for animal welfare for the operation of the Project;
2. Follow the NLP approved structure design, cost estimates, program of works as provided by **ATI-RTC X** and affix the building roof with "DA-NLP" and "INSPIRE 2024" letterings;
3. Implement the project in compliance to the provisions of the project proposal duly approved by the **ATI-RTC X**;

4. Be responsible for the licenses, permits and other legal requirements for the construction of animal housing/facilities (if there is an infra component);
5. Be responsible for any other expenses not covered by the **ATI-RTC X** funding;
6. Undertake the bidding and awarding process through the LGU BAC with the representative of the **ATI-RTC X** as observer;
7. Implement the project in conformity with the provisions of this MOA and in accordance with the components, scope and implementation schedule contained in the Project Proposal that has been given approval by ATI-RTC X Center Director;
8. Administer, manage, and disburse the fund pursuant to the project proposal and deliver the project components that include **Breeder Animals, Housing and Facilities, Farm equipment, supplies and materials** in accordance with applicable laws and pursuant to a sound financial and accounting procedures;
9. Use the fund solely for the implementation of the project and must keep and maintain financial and accounting records for the said fund in accordance with the generally accepted accounting and auditing principles;
10. Submit in writing of any progress, changes, delay or any concern relating to the complete and effective implementation of the project to the **National Livestock Program Director** through **ATI-RTC X**;
11. Provide administrative and management support mechanism necessary for the implementation of the **PROJECT**;
12. Submit its final liquidation of the transferred funds within six (6) months after the completion of the delivery and/or establishment of all the components of the **PROJECT** as specified in the project proposal and documents;
13. Return to **Bureau of Treasury** any unutilized amount if no additional expenditures are intended to be undertaken, within six (6) months after the completion of the delivery and/or establishment of all the components of the **PROJECT**;
14. Copy furnish **ATI-RTC X** on the documents submitted to Bureau of Treasury of the returned unutilized fund;
15. Produce geo-tagged/digital photos/videos that will document the project from the pre-inspection until the post-implementation of the project that will show that the project was done accordingly as required by the Contract;
16. Ensure unlimited access by ATI and DA personnel to all facilities and documents relevant to the monitoring and evaluation on the progress of the project;
17. Prepare and submit monthly report of farrowed sow and number of weanlings;
18. Submit reports with photos as proof regarding repayment (distribution of weaners);
19. Operate the farm following good animal husbandry practices, observance of animal health and welfare principles, and implement sound biosecurity protocols to ensure that the project is sustainable and productive and attains its objectives;

20. Register all animals and offspring to the Philippine Animal Health Information System;
21. Pay the insurance premium for all the breeder stocks to PCIC;
22. Allow all animals and offspring under this Project to be part of the National Genetic Resources Improvement Program (NGRIP) as participating breeder farms and shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the National Animal Genetic Resources Improvement Board (NAGRIB);
23. Assure that the Project is properly identified and labeled as "DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE – NATIONAL LIVESTOCK PROGRAM" at all times;
24. Implement payback scheme by reserving portion of animals produced yearly for distribution as part of the livestock-based livelihood program of the National Livestock Program, until such time that the equivalent number of interventions coming from the Proponent, including the project counterpart components, will offset the project amount value in-kind. *(See Annex 2)*
25. Provide veterinary health services (i.e., deworming, drug administration);
26. Provide necessary requirements for the establishment of the Swine Multiplier Farm (i.e., Environmental Compliance Certificate (ECC), Discharge Permit, Business Permit, Sanitary Permit);
27. Certify mortalities in case of death and disease outbreak signed by a licensed veterinarian;
28. In case of death, provide necropsy and mortality report with photos as proof signed by a licensed veterinarian; and
29. Promote the **PROJECT** in the locality;

D. PENALTY CLAUSE

In the event of non-compliance of the **LGU** with the responsibilities in the MOA such, as but not limited to, non-submission of liquidation reports and failure to return unutilized funds within the period prescribed herein, will deem the **LGU** ineligible for any intervention/project/program of the DA-ATI until such time that all the responsibilities in this project, especially on financial obligations, are fully complied and cleared.

Any dispute, controversy, difference, dispute or claim arising out of, or in relation to this agreement, including any questions as to the interpretation, implementation, existence, validity, breach or termination thereof, or as to any non-contractual obligations arising out of or relating thereto, shall be referred to Arbitration in accordance with the Arbitration Rules in force at the time of the commencement of the arbitration, which rules are deemed incorporated by reference in this clause.

The failure of the arbitration shall be a condition precedent before the parties file an action before the courts.

E. EFFECTIVITY AND DURATION

This agreement shall take effect upon its signing and shall be in force for a period of three (3) years from the date of release of the fund, unless otherwise expressly extended in writing by the parties herein. The approval of the documents that aim to extend the life of the MOA shall be undertaken before the expiration of the original MOA.

Further, The Project shall remain the property of the DA-ATI until the provision on repayment has been complied with.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Agreement entered into and executed by and among:

PILIPINAS SHELL FOUNDATION, INC., a non-stock, non-profit corporation organized under existing Philippine laws, with a principal place of business at The Finance Centre, 41st Floor, 26th Street corner 9th Avenue, Bonifacio Global City, Taguig City, represented herein by its Executive Director, **SEBASTIAN C. QUINIONES**, hereinafter referred to as “**PSFI**”.

-and-

CITY GOVERNMENT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO, a government agency created and organized under existing laws, with principal address at 89 Hayes St., **CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY**, 9000, Misamis Oriental represented herein by its Honorable Mayor, **ROLANDO “KLAREX” UY**, hereinafter referred to as “**LGU-CDO**.”

-WITNESS THAT-

WHEREAS, **PSFI**, established in 1982 as the “social arm” of the Shell companies in the Philippines, is a non-profit organization that works to uplift the lives of the most vulnerable sectors in the Philippines with a focus on six thematic areas: Livelihood, Education, Health and Safety, Environment and Energy and Nutrition and Food Security.

WHEREAS, **PSFI** is implementing the **Sanayan sa Kakayahang Industriyal (SKIL) program** which aims to provide skills training and employment opportunities to bonafide residents of Shell’s host communities in Cagayan de Oro City to contribute to the socio-economic income and employment rate;

WHEREAS, **PSFI**’s beneficiarics shall be termed “**SKIL scholars**” under the **Sanayan sa Kakayahang Industriyal (SKIL) program**;

WHEREAS, **The CITY GOVERNMENT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO** thru the **PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT SERVICES OFFICE** also known as **PESO** aims to provide employment opportunities to the constituents of Cagayan de Oro City;

WHEREAS, **CITY GOVERNMENT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO** has a duly registered training institution called the **CITY COLLEGE OF CAGAYAN DE ORO (CCCDO)** existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Philippines, with principal address at Zone 2, Barangay Agusan, **CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY**;

WHEREAS, **CITY COLLEGE OF CAGAYAN DE ORO** will be the primary institution to provide training to the identified scholars of Cagayan de Oro City through skills training, to obtain greater opportunity in business/livelihood or employment, and thereby improve their economic status;

WHEREAS, **PSFI and LGU-CDO through the CCCDO** shall assist at least 25 scholars each year from 2024 to 2026.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, **PSFI** and **LGU-CDO**, hereinafter collectively referred to as the “**PARTIES**” agree to the following terms and conditions:

1. AGREEMENT COMPOSITION

1.1 **LGU-CDO through the CCCDO** will provide training services to **PSFI**'s identified **SKIL** scholars pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed as a commitment by **PSFI** to avail any services, or minimum quantity thereof, from **CCCDO**.

2. DURATION OF THE AGREEMENT

2.1 The term of this Agreement shall be for a period effective **July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2026**. The term may be renewed for such period as may be mutually agreed upon by both parties in writing.

3. RESPONSIBILITIES OF PSFI

- 3.1 Co-manage the overall implementation of the program from identifying the beneficiaries, screening, and assessment, to the endorsement of the official list of trainees to CCCDO;
- 3.2 Abide with any guidelines and policies of TESDA implemented by CCCDO during the training and assessment of scholars;
- 3.3 Coordinate with the city LGU-CDO, particularly with CCCDO and PESO on program implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of scholars' performance and attitude;
- 3.4 Conduct periodic consultation meetings and engagements with CCCDO and PESO with regard to the progress of the program;
- 3.5 Provide insurance to the scholars within the duration of the training program;
- 3.6 Provide necessary allowance and financial support for the scholars' successful completion of the training, such as, but not limited to:
 - a. Training and SIL/OJT Allowance
 - b. Training Consumables
 - c. Uniform & ID
 - d. Training Insurance
 - e. Post Training Assistance
 - f. COHARA Registration Fee (*for Housekeeping NCII trainees ONLY*)
- 3.7 Facilitate the conduct of the following:
 - a. Scholar's Orientation, option to include parents
 - b. Leadership Enhancement and Attitude Development Workshop
 - c. Safety Leadership Training (as necessary to the course) or Safety Orientation
 - d. Graduation and Culmination Activity
- 3.8 Refer scholars to contractors of the Shell business and/or partner industries for an apprenticeship or on-the-job training;

- 3.9 Co-manage the scholars' performance with CCCDO to ensure completion of training, participation, and attendance to the supplemental activities (*ie., General Assemblies, Orientation Seminars, Career Mentorship Program, Leadership Camps, Literacy Symposium, Sportsfest*) and mandatory activities (*i.e., Graduation Ceremony and Taking of NCII Assessment*).
- 3.10 Coordinate with PESO for a possible job referral or endorsement to PESO's partner industries;
- 3.11 Agree with CCCDO on a Budgetary requirement and definite timeline as stipulated in ANNEX "A" and "B".

4. RESPONSIBILITIES OF LGU-CDO THROUGH CCCDO

- 4.1. Provide the training design for the identified skills training program and have it agreed by both parties
- 4.2. Provide and ensure the availability of trainers, facilities, and equipment for the conduct of skills training program;
- 4.3. Conduct the specified training according to the agreed design and timeframes;
- 4.4. Assist in the assessment and screening of applicants for the program identified by PSFI;
- 4.5. Include and enroll SKIL scholars with the City College of Cagayan de Oro, therefore, providing free-of-charge training fees.
- 4.6. Facilitate monitoring of scholars' performance during actual training and post-training evaluation as needed;
- 4.7. Issue training certificates to the trainees who completed the requirements of the skills training program;
- 4.8. Facilitate the issuance of certification to trainees who will successfully pass the competency assessment subject to the rules and regulations prescribed by TESDA;
- 4.9. Conduct meetings with PSFI when necessary to ensure the success of the program;
- 4.10. Immediately notify the PSFI of the intended termination or underperformance of any scholar/beneficiary, citing the grounds indicated.

5. RESPONSIBILITIES OF LGU-CDO THROUGH PESO

- 5.1 Assist PSFI and CCCDO in screening the scholars and conducting orientation;
- 5.2 Assist PSFI in looking for industry training-related partners after completion of the training;
- 5.3 Assist PSFI and CCCDO in conducting an employment coaching with the scholars;
- 5.4 Lead a local recruitment activity for the scholars post-training; and

5.5 Coordinate with PSFI and CCCDO for possible job referral or endorsement to PESO's partner industries.

6. ANTI-BRIBERY AND CORRUPTION, ANTI-MONEY LAUNDERING CLAUSE

For the purposes of this Agreement:

“Related Party” means in relation to a party to a contract or agreement (a) its subsidiaries, directors or employees, contractors, agents; or (b) any other person or entity, [including that party's affiliates (and its subsidiaries, employees, or directors)] when acting for or on behalf of a party to a contract or agreement or otherwise involved in the performance of the contract or agreement.

“Anti-Corruption Laws” shall mean (a) the United States Foreign Corrupt Practices Act of 1977; (b) the United Kingdom Bribery Act 2010; and (c) all applicable national, regional, provincial, state, municipal or local laws and regulations that prohibit tax evasion, money laundering or otherwise dealing in the proceeds of crime or the bribery of, or the providing of unlawful gratuities, facilitation payments, or other benefits to, any government official or any other person.

“Government Official” shall mean any official or employee of any government, or any agency, ministry, department of a government (at any level), person acting in an official capacity for a government regardless of rank or position, official or employee of an entity wholly or partially controlled by a government (for example, a state-owned oil company), political party and any official of a political party; candidate for political office, officer or employee of a public international organization, such as the United Nations or the World Bank, or immediate family member (meaning a spouse, child, sibling, parent, or household member) of any of the foregoing.

All parties represent, warrant, and covenant that in connection with this Agreement and the business resulting therefrom:

- (i) it is aware of and will comply with Anti-Corruption Laws;
- (ii) whether directly or indirectly, it has not made, offered, authorized, or accepted and will not make, offer, authorize, or accept a bribe, and it has not made, offered, authorized, or accepted and will not make, offer, authorize, or accept a payment, gift, promise, or other advantage, to or for the use or benefit of any Government official or any other person where that payment, gift, promise, or other advantage would comprise a facilitation payment or otherwise violate the Anti-Corruption Laws;
- (iii) it has maintained and will maintain adequate written policies or procedures to comply with Anti-Corruption Laws;
- (iv) it has maintained and will maintain adequate internal controls, including but not limited to using reasonable efforts to ensure that all transactions are accurately recorded and reported in its books and records to reflect truly the activities to which they pertain, such as the purpose of each transaction, with whom it was entered into, for whom it was undertaken, or what was exchanged;
- (v) it will, to its knowledge retain such books and records for the period required by Applicable Law or a Party's own retention policies, whichever is longer;

- (vi) in the event a Party becomes aware it has breached an obligation in this paragraph, it will promptly notify the other Party, subject to the preservation of legal privilege;
- (vii) it has used and will use reasonable efforts to require any [Related Party] or subcontractors, agents, or any other third parties to also comply with the foregoing requirements in this paragraph;
- (viii) it will provide information (which unless publicly available will include documentary evidence) in support of the other/requesting Party's ongoing Know Your Customer ("KYC") process requirements, about its ownership, officers, and corporate structure (including any changes thereto); and
- (ix) only a Party (and not its Affiliates or a third party) shall make payments to the other Party, except with that other Party's prior written consent.

Without limitation to any other available remedies, where a Party or its Related Party fails to comply with this paragraph, the other Party, acting in good faith, shall have a right to notify of such failure to comply. If a Party is capable of curing the failure, it shall have 60 days to cure the failure to the reasonable satisfaction of the other Party. If the failure is incapable of being cured or has not been cured to the reasonable satisfaction of the other Party within sixty (60) days, the Party shall have the right to terminate the Agreement on further notice. Nothing in this Agreement shall require a Party to perform any part of this Agreement or take any actions if, by doing so, the Party would not comply with the Anti-Corruption Laws. The obligations in this paragraph shall survive the termination or expiry of this Agreement.

All parties shall indemnify SHELL for any losses, liabilities (including but not limited to fines and penalties), damages, costs incurred by or claims or proceedings instituted against SHELL arising from or in connection with Counterparty or its Related Parties' failure to comply with this clause.

Subject to the preservation of legal privilege, during the Term and for 7 years thereafter and on reasonable notice, each Party shall have a right, at its expense, and the other Party shall take reasonable steps to enable this right, to audit the other Party's relevant books and records with respect to compliance with this paragraph.

7. GOVERNING LAW, JURISDICTION AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Any dispute, controversy or claim arising out of or in connection with this Agreement or its subject matter or formation, whether in tort, contract, under statute, or otherwise, including any question regarding its existence, validity, interpretation, breach or termination, and including any non-contractual claim (a "Dispute"), shall be finally and exclusively resolved by arbitration under the arbitration rules of Philippine Dispute Resolution Center, Inc. ("PDRCI") (the "Rules"), which Rules are deemed to be incorporated by reference into this Agreement.

- i. The arbitral tribunal (the "Tribunal") shall consist of one arbitrator, to be appointed in accordance with the Rules.
- ii. The venue of the arbitration shall be Cagayan de Oro City, Philippines
- iii. The language of the arbitration shall be English.
- iv. The appointing authority shall be PDRCI.

- v. Any award rendered by the Tribunal shall be made in writing and shall be final and binding on the Parties. The Parties undertake to carry out the award without delay.
- vi. All aspects of the arbitration shall be confidential. Save to the extent required by law or pursuant to any proceedings to enforce or challenge an award, no aspect of the proceedings, documentation, or any (partial or final) award or order or any other matter connected with the arbitration shall be disclosed to any other person by either party or its counsel, agents, corporate parents, affiliates or subsidiaries without the prior written consent of the other party/parties.

8. ENTRY INTO FORCE, AMENDMENT, VALIDITY, AND TERMINATION

- 1. This Memorandum of Agreement shall have a term of **two (2) years** and shall take effect upon signing hereof and shall remain valid until **June 30, 2026**, or unless terminated by mutual consent of all parties;
- 2. Any amendment or modification must be put in writing and duly executed by each of the parties in the same manner as the execution of this MOA;
- 3. All parties may terminate this MOA by giving at least thirty days prior written notice. Any such termination or cancellation shall be carried out in a manner, which shall not unduly prejudice activities already commenced (at the time that notice is received) for the benefit of third parties, and the parties agree to ensure an orderly hand-over and transition;

LANCELOT B. PADLA, FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE PROPOSED SUPER HEALTH CENTER, A PROJECT TO BE FUNDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH (DOH); AND AS A NECESSARY CONSEQUENCE THEREOF IS THE UTILIZATION OF A PORTION OF THE CAGAYAN DE ORO RESETTLEMENT AND SOCIALIZED HOUSING PROJECT 1 PHASE 2A (CDORSHP 1 P2A) LOCATED AT SITIO CALAANAN, BARANGAY CANITOAN, THIS CITY, PARTICULARLY, LOT 1-A, PORTION OF LOT 1 BLOCK 31 OF THE SUBDIVISION PLAN PSD 10-000939, WITH AN AREA OF NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY-TWO (982) SQ. M., MORE OR LESS.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:

This refers to the request of the undersigned for the grant of authority to represent the City Government of Cagayan de Oro, as the Local Chief Executive, to enter into and sign the *Deed of Usufruct* with the Barangay Government of Canitoan, Cagayan de Oro City, represented by its Barangay Chairman, **HON. LANCELOT B. PADLA**, for the establishment of the proposed **Super Health Center**, a project to be funded by the Department of Health (DOH); and as a necessary consequence thereof is the utilization of **a portion of the Cagayan de Oro Resettlement and Socialized Housing Project 1 Phase 2A (CDORSHP 1 P2A) located at Sitio Calaanan, Barangay Canitoan, this city, particularly, Lot 1-A, portion of Lot 1 Block 31 of the Subdivision Plan Psd 10-000939, with an area Nine Hundred Eighty-Two (982) sq. m., more or less.**

The above-mentioned *Deed of Usufruct* is for the establishment of the Super Health Center, a project to be **funded by the DOH** as part of the national government's effort to boost universal healthcare and to decongest hospitals. With this *Usufruct Agreement*, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro voluntarily and freely grants to the Barangay Government of Canitoan the right to use and enjoy the fruits of the above-mentioned lot, to enable the latter to effectively perform its duties and functions of providing accessible and quality health care services through the Super Health Center.

As a city-owned resettlement site, the City Housing and Urban Development Department (CHUDD) issued a Certification dated 21 June 2024 to the effect that the lot area is **suitable for the proposed Super Health Center project of the DOH.** An ocular inspection and evaluation of the lot has likewise been conducted by the said Office as indicated in the attached location map, vicinity map, and site development plan. Moreover, the City Legal Office has prepared the *Deed of Usufruct* and issued its legal opinion dated 4 July 2024.

For this reason, I respectfully request that the above-mentioned Ordinance be enacted, signified as **urgent**, authorizing the undersigned to enter into and sign the aforesaid *Deed of Usufruct*, to be entered by and between the City Government of Cagayan de Oro and Barangay Government of Canitoan represented by its Barangay Chairman, Hon. Lancelot B. Padla.

THE BARANGAY GOVERNMENT OF CANITOAN, CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY, a local government unit, created under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with office address at the Barangay, herein represented by Barangay Chairman, **HON. LANCELOT B. PADLA**, duly authorized to enter into and sign the Deed by virtue of the Sangguniang Barangay Resolution No. _____, Series _____, hereinafter known and referred to as the "**USUFRUCTUARY**";

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the **OWNER**, through the City Housing and Urban Development Department (CHUDD), certified to the effect that Lot 1-A, portion of Lot 1 Block 31 of the Subdivision Plan Psd 10-000939, located at Cagayan de Oro Resettlement and Socialized Housing Project 1 Phase 2A (CDORSHP 1 P2A), Sitio Calaanan, Barangay Canitoan, this City, with an area of 982.45 sq. m., more or less, is suitable for the proposed Super Health Center Project of the Department of Health (DOH);

*(A copy of the said Certification is hereto attached as **ANNEX "H"**, to form an integral part hereof)*

WHEREAS, Section 15, Article II of the 1987 Constitution provides as a policy of the State *"to protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them"*;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 11223, otherwise known as the *"Universal Health Care Act"*, acknowledged and recognized the establishment of health care facilities devoted primarily to the provision of services for health promotion, prevention, diagnosis, treatment, rehabilitation and palliation of individuals suffering from illness, disease, injury, disability, or deformity, or in need of obstetrical or other medical and nursing care;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code states that *"Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential for the general welfare"*;

WHEREAS, the establishment of the Super Health Center is to be funded by the DOH as part of the national government's effort to boost universal healthcare and to decongest hospitals;

WHEREAS, the **OWNER** and the **USUFRUCTUARY** are committed to ensuring easy access to health services, providing primary health care services to their constituents, and helping decongest hospitals since residents can already avail of primary health care services in the Super Health Center instead of in the hospital;

WHEREAS, the **OWNER** commits to collaborating and assisting the **USUFRUCTUARY** in the effective performance of its duties and functions, particularly, in its effort to ensure easy access to quality health care services in the Barangay and to decongest hospitals by availing primary health care in the Super Health Center;

WHEREAS, the **OWNER**, as an act of liberality and generosity, hereby voluntarily and freely grants to the **USUFRUCTUARY**, the right to use and enjoy the fruits of the **SUBJECT PROPERTY**, to enable the latter to effectively perform its objective of providing health care services through the establishment of a Super Health Center;

WHEREAS, the **USUFRUCTUARY** hereby accepts this generous act of the **OWNER** with profound gratitude and deep appreciation;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises and the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, the **PARTIES** hereby agree on the following terms and conditions:

1. **TERM AND EXCLUSIVE USE** – The term of the usufruct is for **Twenty-Five (25) years** commencing from the execution of this Deed of Usufruct. This term is **renewable** upon mutual agreement of the **PARTIES** herein.

The **USUFRUCTUARY** is hereby given the right and privilege to use the **SUBJECT PROPERTY** on the condition that it shall be **exclusively used** as the future site of the Super Health Center. Thus, any deviation from the condition upon which the instant usufruct is granted to the **USUFRUCTUARY** shall entitle the **OWNER** to cause the **immediate cancellation/termination** of this Deed of Usufruct and immediately recover and regain the possession of the **SUBJECT PROPERTY**.

2. **NON-TRANSFERABLE RIGHTS; PEACEFUL POSSESSION** – The **USUFRUCTUARY** is **prohibited** from directly or indirectly assigning or transferring its usufructuary rights over the **SUBJECT PROPERTY**, wholly or partially, under any circumstance, whatsoever. Any such transfer made in violation of this clause shall be **null and void**.

The **USUFRUCTUARY** shall maintain peaceful possession and prevent illegal/informal settlers within the vicinity of the **SUBJECT PROPERTY** throughout this Deed of Usufruct.

3. **PROPERTY USE; MAINTENANCE AND CARE, FACILITIES, UTILITIES ETC.** – The **USUFRUCTUARY** shall exercise due diligence to preserve and protect the **SUBJECT PROPERTY**. The **USUFRUCTUARY** shall use the **SUBJECT PROPERTY** **exclusively** and may make **minor improvement/s** on the **SUBJECT PROPERTY** **at its own account**.

The **USUFRUCTUARY** shall be **solely responsible** for the upkeep and the maintenance and care of the **SUBJECT PROPERTY**, keeping it at all times, in a clean, sanitary and non-hazardous condition. The **USUFRUCTUARY** shall ensure that no flammable materials/substance shall be stored in the premises of the **SUBJECT PROPERTY**

Any installation of facilities such as telephone, water, electricity, etc., shall be for the **sole account and expense** of the **USUFRUCTUARY**. In addition, the **USUFRUCTUARY** shall **pay the necessary licenses, taxes, fees, and other imposition** that may be imposed, levied and collected by duly constituted authorities.

4. **OWNERSHIP** – The **USUFRUCTUARY** holds the usufruct and beneficial use of the **SUBJECT PROPERTY**, while ownership and title remain with the **OWNER**.
5. **IMPROVEMENTS** – The **USUFRUCTUARY** may, following appropriate coordination with the **OWNER**, undertake the construction of infrastructure,

facilities and/or improvements upon the **SUBJECT PROPERTY**, pursuant to the submitted and approved plans, as permitted by the **OWNER**.

Upon the expiration or non-renewal of the instant Usufruct, any and all permanent improvements introduced by the **USUFRUCTUARY** upon the **SUBJECT PROPERTY**, particularly those improvement/s which cannot be removed without causing damage to the **SUBJECT PROPERTY** shall accrue to the benefit of the **OWNER** without any corresponding obligation on the part of the latter to reimburse the **USUFRUCTUARY** for the cost of the said improvement/s.

6. **CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE** – The construction and maintenance of the infrastructure, facilities, and/or improvements in the **SUBJECT PROPERTY** shall adhere to the applicable City Ordinances and National Laws on safety, integrity, and environmental preservation.
7. **CONSTRUCTION PERIOD; PERMITS** - The construction of the facility of which this Deed of Usufruct is agreed upon must be commenced by the **USUFRUCTUARY** within two (2) years from the date of notarization of this agreement. Otherwise, the non-construction of the facility shall be a ground for the cancellation of this Deed of Usufruct.

The **USUFRUCTUARY** shall be responsible for the processing of all permits needed for the construction and utilization of the Super Health Center.

8. **NO SUBLEASE CLAUSE** - The **USUFRUCTUARY** shall not assign, transfer, let, or sublease all or any part of the **SUBJECT PROPERTY** without the prior written consent of the **OWNER**.
9. **AMENDMENTS AND TERMINATION; BREACH OF AGREEMENT** - This Deed of Usufruct and its terms cannot be amended, waived, modified, discharged, or terminated orally. Changes herein shall require the written and mutual agreement between the **PARTIES**.

The **USUFRUCTUARY** shall notify in writing the **OWNER** at least sixty (60) days in advance should it decide to vacate the **SUBJECT PROPERTY** stating the: [1] ground/s for pre-termination; and the [2] date of effectivity of the pre-termination.

Upon cancellation and/or termination of this Deed of Usufruct, the **USUFRUCTUARY** hereby grants to the **OWNER** the legal right to enter and take possession of the **SUBJECT PROPERTY** as though the term of this Deed of Usufruct has expired. In case of violation by the **USUFRUCTUARY** of any of the terms and conditions herein shall *ipso facto* caused the rescission of this Deed of Usufruct.

10. **NON-WAIVER OF RIGHTS** - Failure of the **OWNER** to insist upon a strict performance of any of the terms, conditions and covenants hereof shall not be deemed a relinquishment or waiver of any right nor shall it be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach or default of the terms and conditions herein contained. No waiver of the **OWNER** shall be deemed to have been made unless expressed in writing and signed by the **OWNER**;
11. **LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES**- The **USUFRUCTUARY** is fully responsible for any damage caused to the person or property of third persons while remaining casually or on business in any part of the **SUBJECT PROPERTY** and further binds itself to hold the **OWNER** free and harmless from any such claim or injury or damage.

The **USUFRUCTUARY** shall cause the removal and/or eviction of any existing structures or improvements in the **SUBJECT PROPERTY**. The **OWNER** shall not be under any liability to the **USUFRUCTUARY** or **THIRD PARTIES** for any accident, damage, loss, injury, expense, or inconvenience which may be suffered, incurred, or arise directly or indirectly as a result thereof.

12. **FORCE MAJEURE** - The **OWNER** shall not be responsible or liable for delays in the performance of its obligations when caused by, related to, or arising out of acts of God, quarantines, weather, national, regional, or local disasters, calamities or catastrophes, inability to obtain labor or materials (or reasonable substitute therefore at reasonable cost or failure of, or inability to obtain utilities necessary for performance), governmental restrictions, orders, limitations, regulations, or controls, national emergencies, delay in issuance or revocation of permits, enemy or hostile governmental action and other cause or events beyond its reasonable control ("*Force Majeure*").

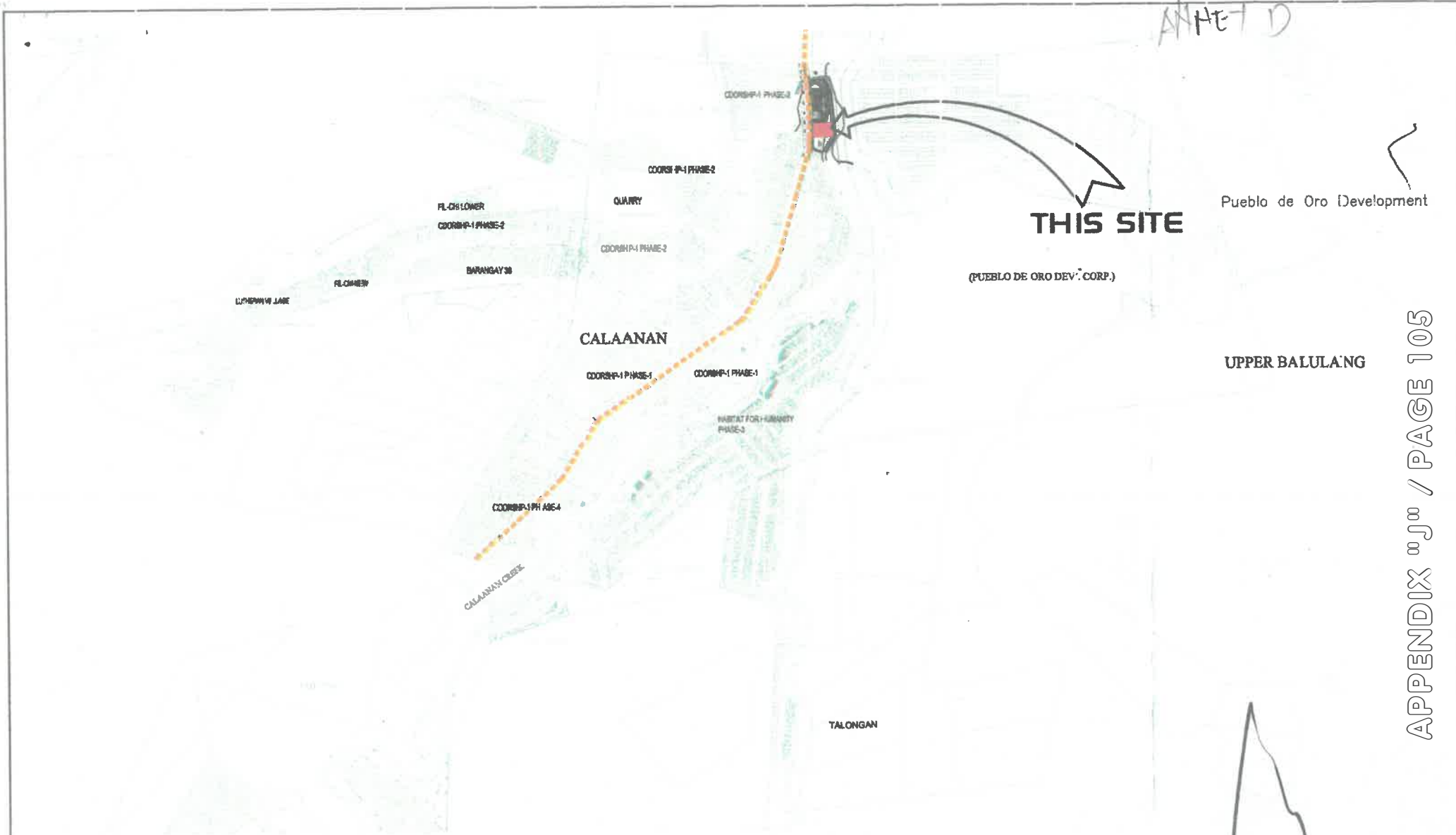

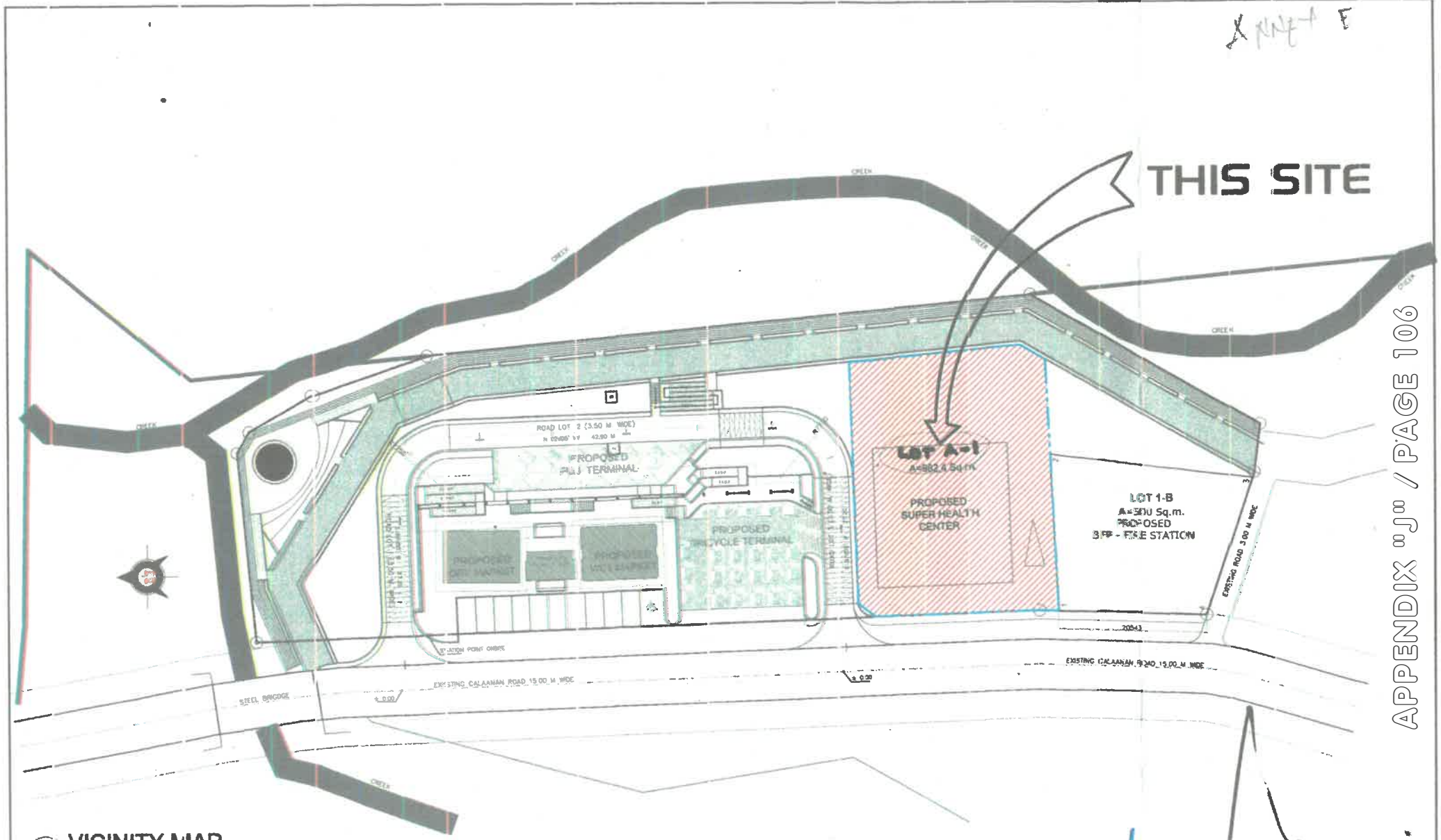

Likewise, this Office has thoroughly reviewed the documents pertaining to the above-mentioned lot and find the same to be in legal order and thus pose no legal objection thereto. Provided, however, that the subject lot is free and/or cleared from any existing structures and/or improvements occupying the area.

Accordingly, this Office recommends that said *Deed of Usufruct* be duly forwarded to the Honorable Members of the City Council for their favorable consideration, with a request for an Ordinance authorizing the City Mayor to enter into and sign the same, pursuant to Sec. 455 (b) (1) (vi) of the Local Government Code.
